Most of the animals were part of a sideshow. While vendors were outside selling candy floss and apples, dolls, elephant rides and circus souvenirs, a fire swantower and magician were inside one of the tents performing their stunts. Forming the one wall of the tent were the animals, in their small cages.

The magician took volunteers out of the audience and revealed some of his tricks. Inside another big tent, which seated a total of over 1,600 people during the two shows, were three rings for the different acts. Clowns lined the tent and helped sell the many goodies which were advertised between acts.

The show consisted of balancing acts, dancing horses, performing elephants, young boys on the trampolene and an elephant / tractor tugof-war. Some of the acts were performed simultaneously in the first and third ring while the centre ring was reserved for special acts.

A broken public address system hampered the first show, causing delays and wearing patience in the audience. Some people left before the show got started.

#### Sponsor disappointed


Mike Worthington, president of the Chamber of Commerce, was disappointed in the shows. "I was appalled by the commercialism in the circus," he told this paper after-

He was also disturbed by the children who kept running from ring to ring during the first performance. "It distracted the other people try-ing to watch the show," he

Although he has had quite a few negative comments made by adults since the night of the circus, Mr. Worthington feels the children were pleased, and that is who they were "None of us on the Cham-

ber had ever seen the show before. It was all completely by the Royal Bros. We were just as disappointed as anyone else."

Advanced ticket sales amounted to 1,000, with 300 children and 400 adults buying tickets at the gate. The profit made by the Chamber


