CRAWFORD LAKE

CRAWFORD LAKE is Meromictic, which means there is no natural turnover of the water: The lake retains any debris which falls into it—like yesterday's leaf or a twig from 500 years ago. About seven acres in area it is like a capsule of frozen time for the scientist. Geologists from the Royal Ontario Museum, using lake debris, can analyze the types of people who inhabited the area thousands of years ago, and their lifestyle. Fossilized maize pollen indicated an Indian village nearby in the 14th century and it was found just north of the lake.
