GO loses Polar Bears

The recent loss of the Polar Bear Express cars from the Georgetown GO transit system has forced over 200 commuters to stand throughout the daily trip to and from Toronto.

When the seven green Polar Bear coaches returned to northern Ontario this spring Georgetown's GO route lost 176 seats. The Bear cars have returned to their old job of carrying tourists from Cochrane to Moosonee. Ontario Northland Railway operates the one day excursion trips all summer.

When the Polar Bear arrived last fall Georgetown GO was carrying 2,440 passengers every day but by the spring that number had climbed to 3,063.
