Communal wells standards sought

Halton Region's Planning committee will commission a eport suggesting standards hat could be used in consection with development pased on common wells.

For several months both the public works committee and council have been considering development on communal wells. Both public works and planning committees have recommended the region stay away from the communal well aspect.

Provincial legislation makes it mandatory for the region to guarantee a water supply for any common or communal well development with over four or five units lepending on it.

Region's problem The inherent danger is that the region could face heavy costs of providing water if iomething should affect the

quality or quantity of water at some future date.

Councillor Terry Mannell asked the committee to consider investigating the possibility of having limited development on wells. He sald the region should not assume responsibility for guaranteeing water supplies outside the urban places but argued there was no reason why some development couldn't take place on common wells.

Councillor Jim Watson was a strong advocate of common wells. He agreed with Mannell's suggestion and insisted that development be carried on, only after tests were taken to make sure a good supply of water existed.

There are some small subdivisions in Halton now working on the basis of a questions: communal well.
