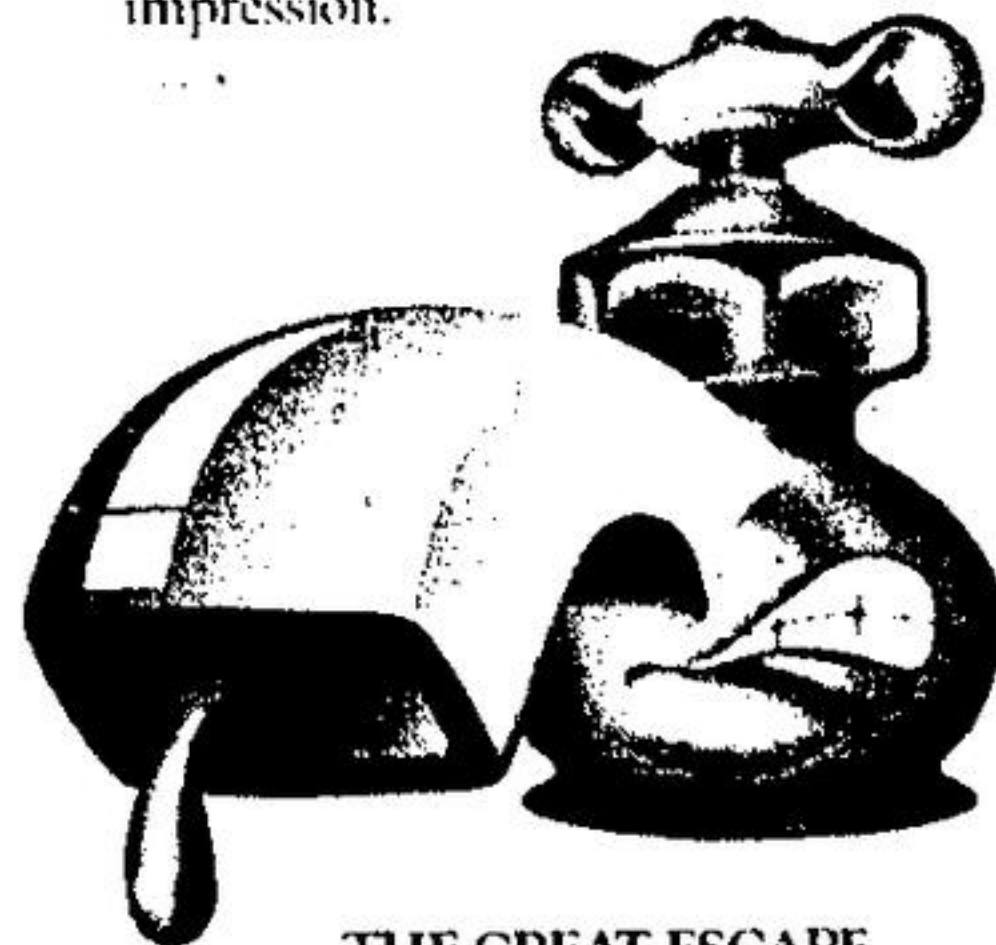

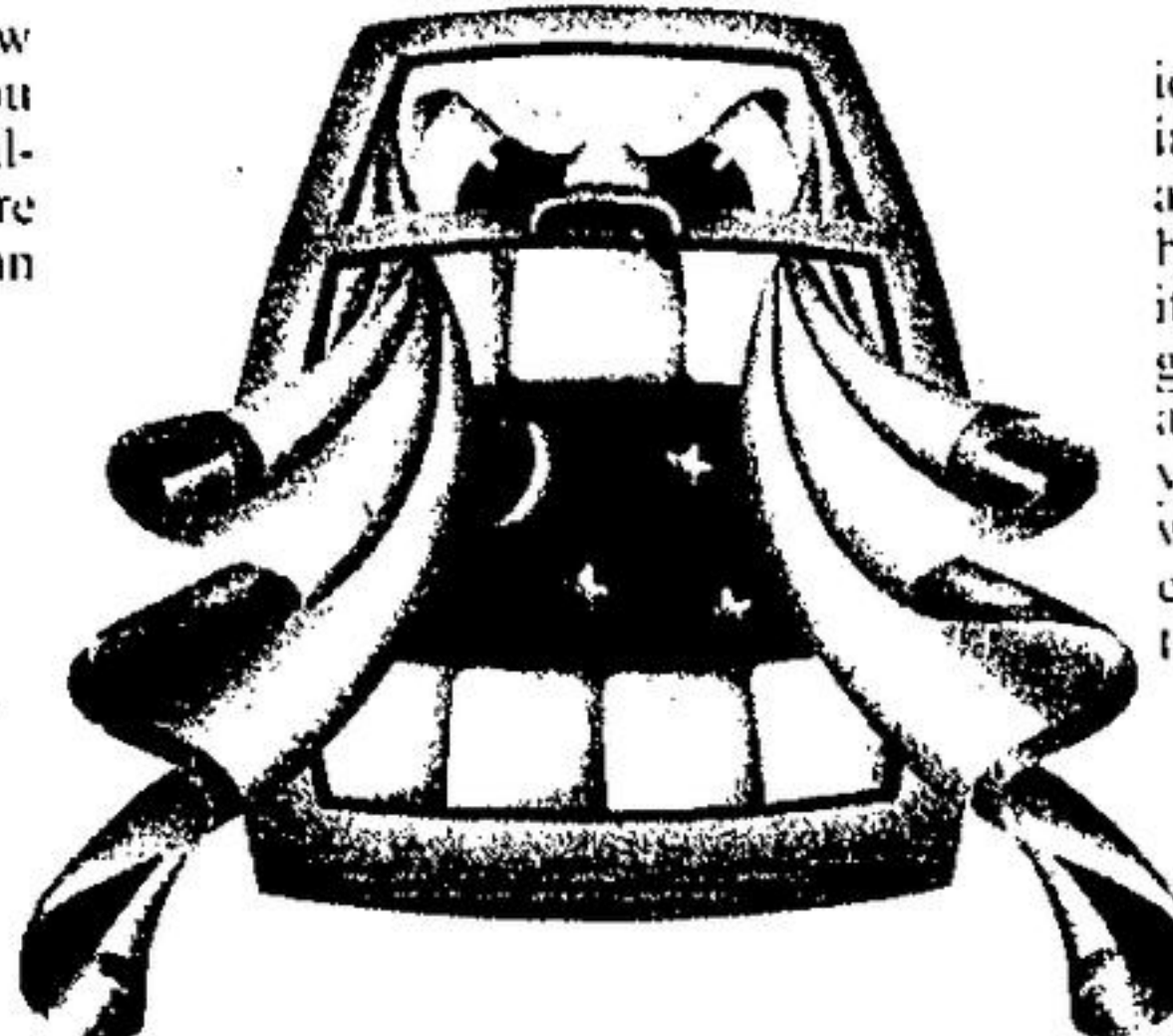
YOUR FIRST TAP LESSON.

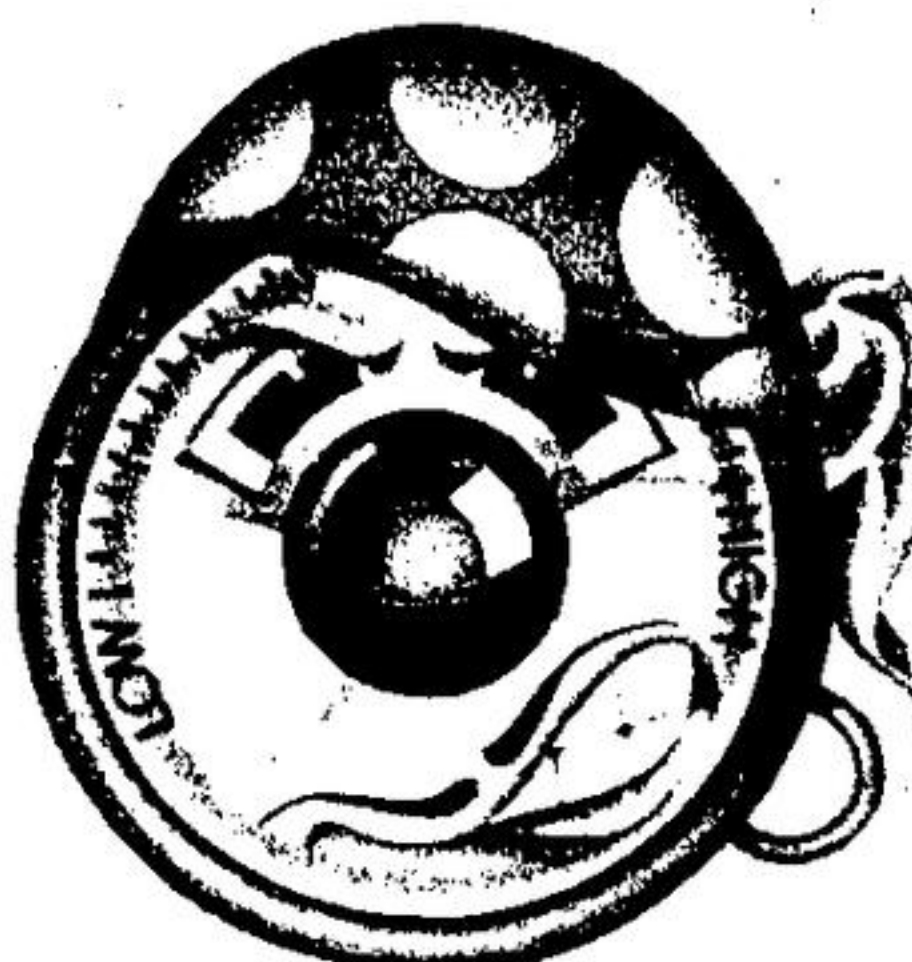
THE GREAT ESCAPE.

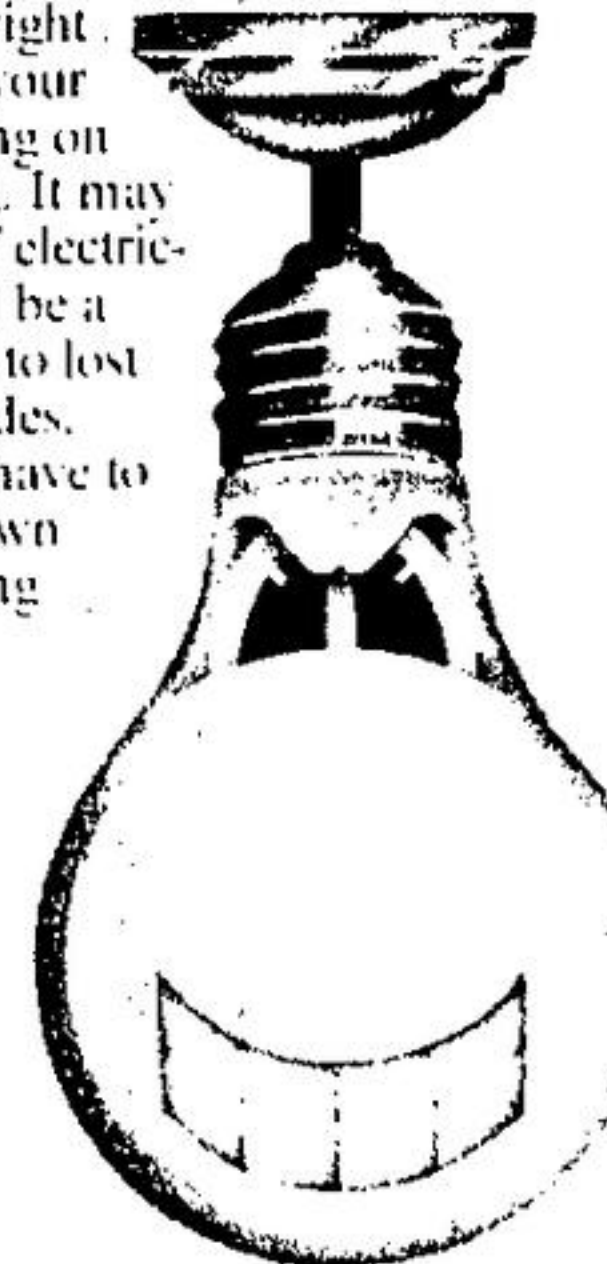


THE WHEEL OF FORTUNE.

Pick a number. Any number. But keep that thermostat wheel spinning. If you're lucky, you might even reach 100. In any case you're bound to win a fortune in heating bills.

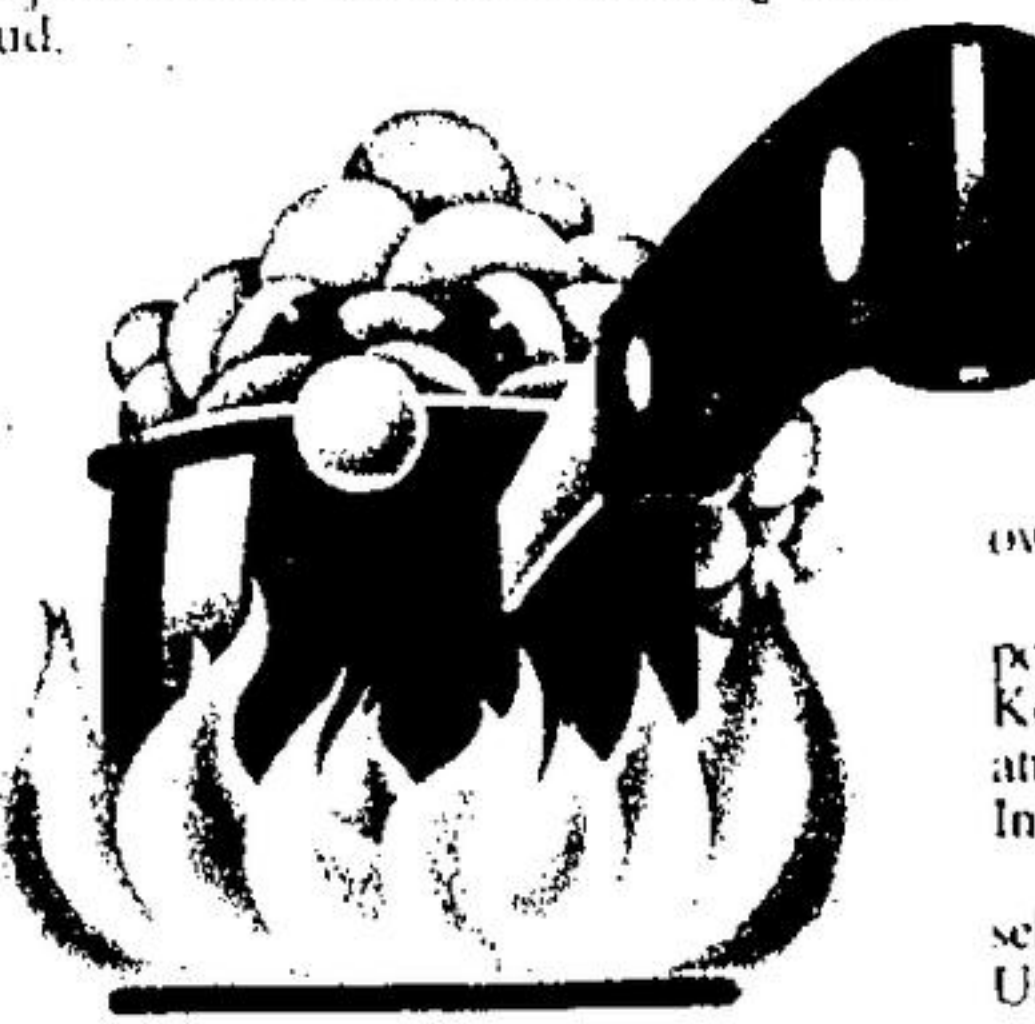
LET YOUR LITTLE LIGHT SHINE.
