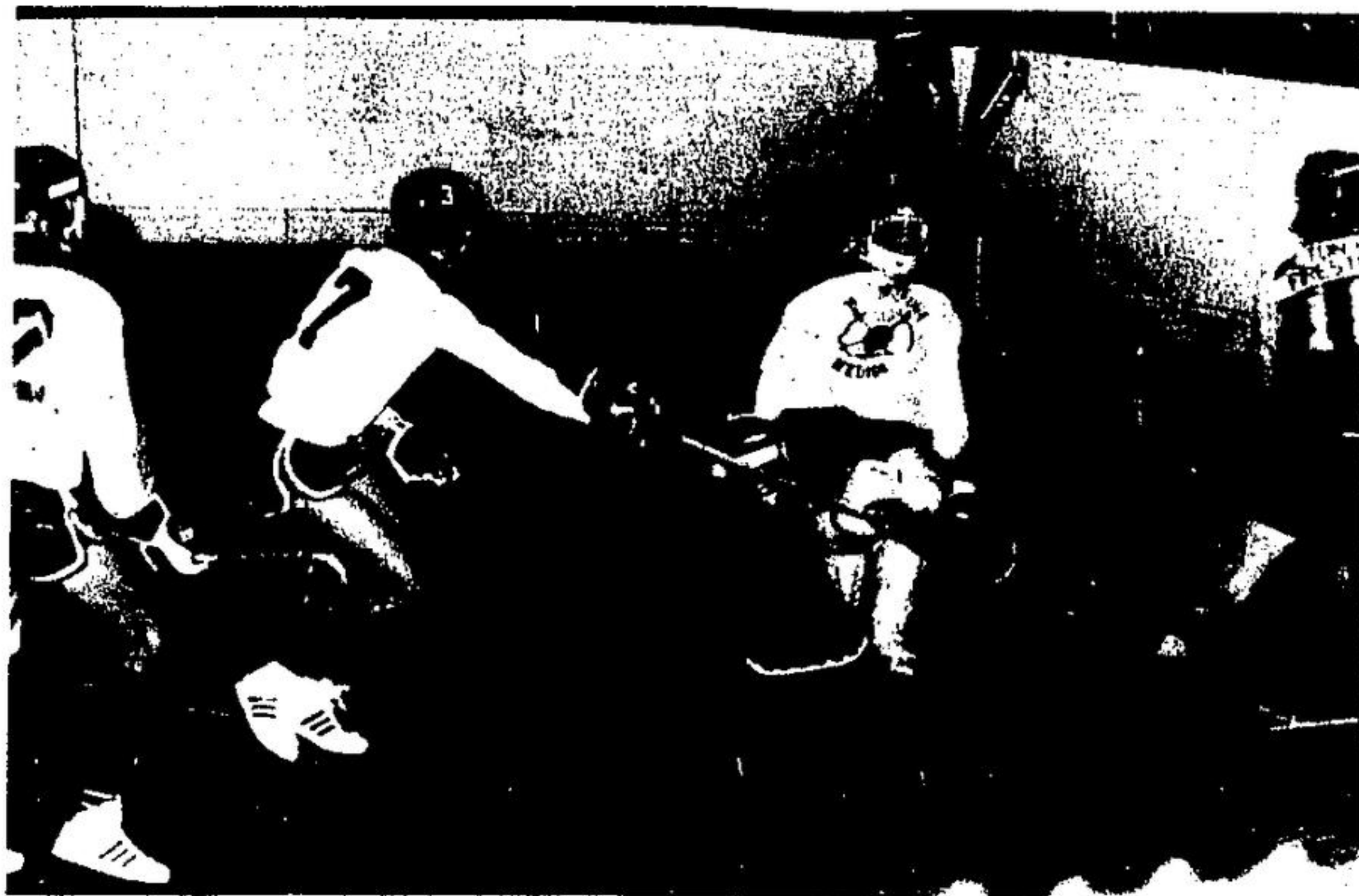
Tallying two runs apiece were Scott Hibbard, Chris Hahn and Shane Steeves.
