Rev. Barrow baptized Christie, infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Johnson during Sun. service.

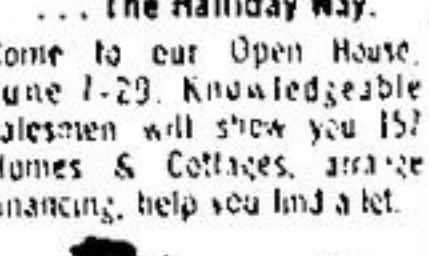

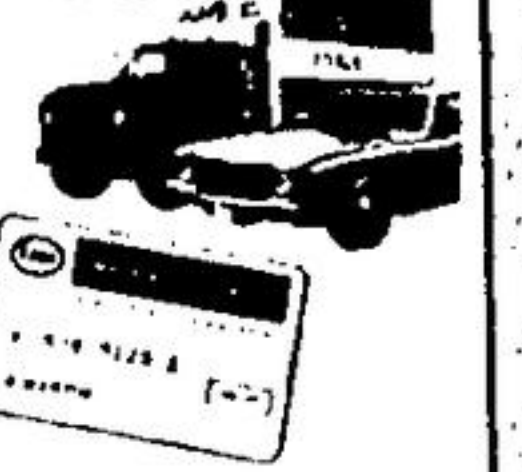

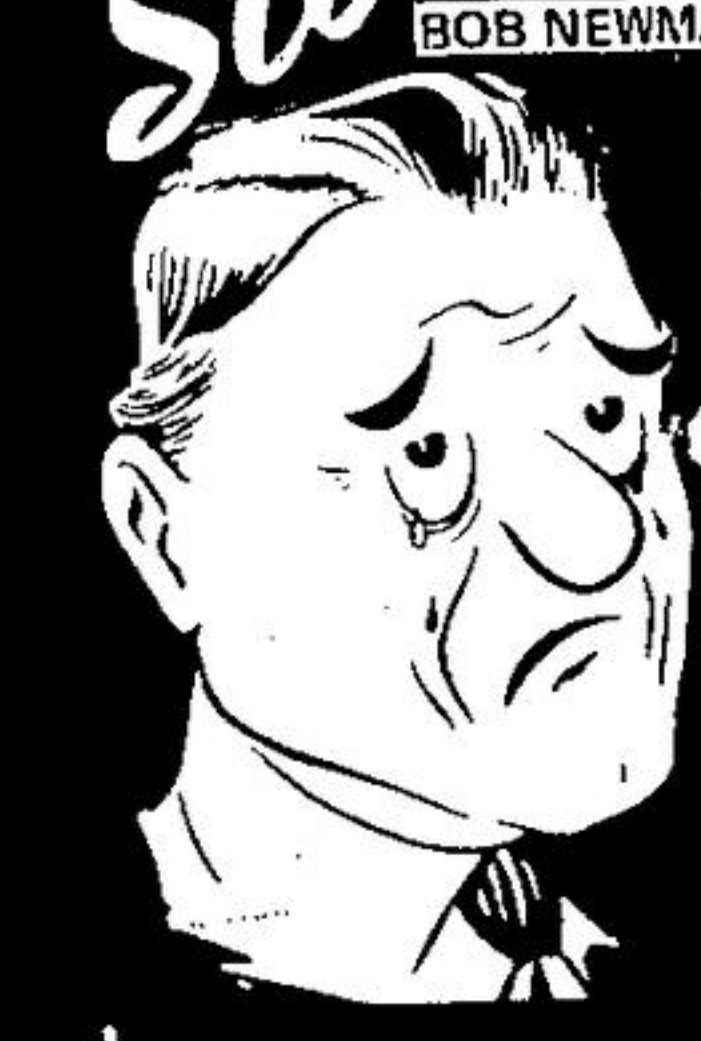
