

# Retrieve objects from dark lake wildflower sanctuary



With only one minute of air remaining in their air tanks, Paul Neilsen and Tom D'Entremont from the Guelph and District Underwater Association surfaced from the depths of Fairy Lake bringing with them a centreboard from a sailboat.

Thursday evening, the two men donned their scuba gear in Prospect Park to begin the underwater search for an outboard motor belonging to Herman Mischkot of Brampton and the piece of the sailboat belonging to Paul Petit. It was the boat featured on the first page of the Free Press on June 18.

The outboard was found first under 30 feet of water. At the spot it was retrieved, visibility was only nine inches, even with flashlights. The temperature of the water was 34 degrees.

The centreboard was harder to spot. In the particular part of the lake where it was lost, visibility was zero, and the object was black. Gloves could not be used, as bare hands were necessary for feeling around for the board. At the 38 minute mark, it was located and brought to the surface with ropes.

Haltom Hills administration threw their support behind the efforts of the Federated Garden Clubs of Ontario to establish a wildflower sanctuary on the 40 acre town-owned land at Silvercreek, site of the old Georgetown reservoir.

The committee recommended they indicate their support and write to the Credit Valley Conservation Authority and the Niagara Escarpment Commission asking under what terms maintenance and grants would be available.

Mrs. Ethel Gardiner of the Garden Club of Hamilton, said the Federated Garden Clubs are interested in preserving native plants, trees and soil, and pointed out the search for such a spot had been started in 1972.

She said to that purpose the members raised \$10,000, and after many visits decided the ideal spot, described in an earlier letter as "a little gem, an oasis of unspoiled beauty," was the old reservoir property.

She claimed the area could become a focal point of the town, attracting students of all ages and naturalists from miles around. She warned the area could not be thrown open indiscriminately, but only by guided tours.

She said they had reached the point of a formal agreement with the CVCA area and found it was owned by Haltom Hills.

Mr. Gardiner said conveyance to the CVCA would ensure the area being kept in private and maintained. She pointed out the \$10,000 would be used toward tending the property.

Committee sanctions Beardmore permission

He said a culvert takes the water from Main Street south to Beardmore. He added it would be costly to take the water over to Beardmore Creek because the system would have to be built through a hill.

## Sewage plant research costs another \$40,000

Haltom Regional Council last week authorized a further \$40,000 expenditure for research into sewage treatment plants in Oakville, Milton and Acton and water pollution in general.

The work is to be undertaken by Pollutech Pollution Advisory Services Ltd. of Oakville, the firm which just completed an interim progress report on the subject.

The request for additional investigation came from the regional public works committee which met to discuss the progress report a day earlier.

Regional Councillor Jim Watson said more information was necessary "to give us something to verify or disprove" figures used by the Ministry of the Environment.

## Stewart attacks Liberal spending

The Hon. William Stewart Minister of Agriculture for Ontario attacked Liberal spending when he spoke to 650 Tories at the Haltom-Burlington nomination convention, June 5.

He said the Liberals had spent more than all other governments combined over the past 101 years. "Trudeau is supporting Nixon, and Ontario doesn't need that kind of support."

The Minister said the Liberals want to increase the educational spending to 80 per cent, which he claimed would add half a billion dollars to the provincial budget.

"One Liberal spokesman came up with a denticare program which would cost \$147 million, and the next day he was rebuked by Nixon. Who do you believe?" asked Stewart.

Contrasting the size of the civil service in Ontario and Ottawa, Stewart said the service has been frozen at its present size, and has only been allowed to grow 10 percent in the last few years, while the federal government has allowed the civil service to double in the last seven years.

"No wonder Nixon doesn't want to talk policy, if that's all he has to talk about," Stewart told the Tories if
