Putting some country into the city boy

Jamie Kattanack is a city boy who is finding it very easy to adjust to country living. He's one of 200 teen-agers enjoying a new learning experience by working and living on a farm this summer. "At home I'd probably be riding my mini-bike around and not doing much of anything," he says as he helps with the threshing on the Gordon Fisher farm on 10 Side-

road. For \$11 per day plus room and board with the Fishers Jamie is learning first-hand how to milk cows as well as do the many chores connected with mixed farming.

Part of the Junior Agriculturalist Program with the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food, the project is considered more a learning experience than a labor program. Popular with young people, there were 650 applications for the 200 jobs available. This is the third year of the program, \$8 is paid by the ministry and \$3 plus board by the Fishers.

Jamie finds the work hard but admits he really likes it. It didn't take him long to drive the tractor—he learned on the garden tractor at home. He attended an

orienting program at Trent University in Peterborough before spending nine weeks on the farm.

Other training programs took place at Guelph, Kemptville and Centralia Agricultural Colleges. The applicants were chosen for their interest in agriculture, future plans, maturity, willingness to work, ability to communicate and acceptance of responsibility.

In Halton Robert Bullock is on the Powandunk Farm, Guelph Line, Jane Allen is with the Murray Connigan family on the Eighth Line, and Wayne Chisholm is on the Don Brander farm on the Ninth Line.

CVCA request turned down

A request by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority to consolidate member representation in the north has been turned down by the Chairman's Committee of the Ontario Conservation Authorities.

Presently, the northern end of the Credit Valley, containing the greatest portion of the watershed, is represented by five members of municipalities: Henry Wheeler of Erin Village; Bill Wheeler of Erin Township; Murray Bryan of East Garafraxa; C. Bryan of Amaranth; Eric White of Mono; and H. P. Daraugh of Orangeville.

According to an authority spokesman, for some time the general feeling has been to promote consolidating Erin and Erin Township; East Garafraxa, Amaranth, and Mono; and Orangeville. The three resulting municipalities would require representation by only three members, allowing the Peel and Mississauga regions to pick up the extra representation.

According to a letter received recently by the Authority, the Chairman's Committee feels the present grouping of the three northern municipalities provides favorable representation of one member for approximately 500 people.
