Maplehurst a second chance for offenders

Doors swung open at Maplehurst Correctional Centre Thursday and close to 2,000 people got their first glimpse of the \$15,500,000 institution and the new philosophy that it represents.

A press conference for Hamilton, Toronto and Milton reporters in the morning and

an official opening in the afternoon preceded an evening open house. An estimated 2,500 attended the open house.

While its probably unfair to describe the facility as plush its safe to say that planners and designers explored every aspect of life in a correctional centre and very little if anything was forgotten.

The colorful entrance and attractive foyer is more like an entrance to a community college than a detention centre.

Vast building
The vast building features openness and yet tight security measures are in force. Movement throughout the building is controlled from a control centre and a device there resembles that which an air controller would use at a modern airport.

Two gyms, a hobby room, an outdoor rink and playing fields and a track are like recreational opportunities for those incarcerated there.

Shops, labs and classrooms are set up to handle a wide

variety of skills. Facilities there will accommodate young offenders in their efforts to upgrade academic standards or embark on trades in woodwork, sheet metal, drafting, auto mechanics and graphic arts to name a few.

Maplehurst superintendent John Main explained the little red school house approach was being used at the centre. He noted that in most classes the class size wouldn't exceed eight persons.

"Many people experience their first sense of failure in the education system outside," Mr. Main points out. He explains the characteristics of the inmates that will be at the Milton centre is an inadequate education and poor employment record. "They are usually the last to be hired and the first to be laid off."

Life skills
Life skills is one of the programs featured at the institution. That includes everything from applying for a job,

buying a car, a house and raising a family.

Selected inmates will be chosen to work for industrial firms that set up shop in the complex. Those inmates will pay room and board, support their family on the outside and pay the same deductions that they would if working in a private business outside the institution.

Each inmate is required to sign a contract when he is admitted. That contract sets out what the inmate or resident intends to do with himself during the length of his sentence.

Training
That could involve training for employment, working with AA to beat a drinking problem or in some cases even taking up new hobbies or developing interests to occupy leisure time.

Mr. Main points out that those who don't abide by the terms of the contract jeopardize their privilege of using the facilities in the institution.

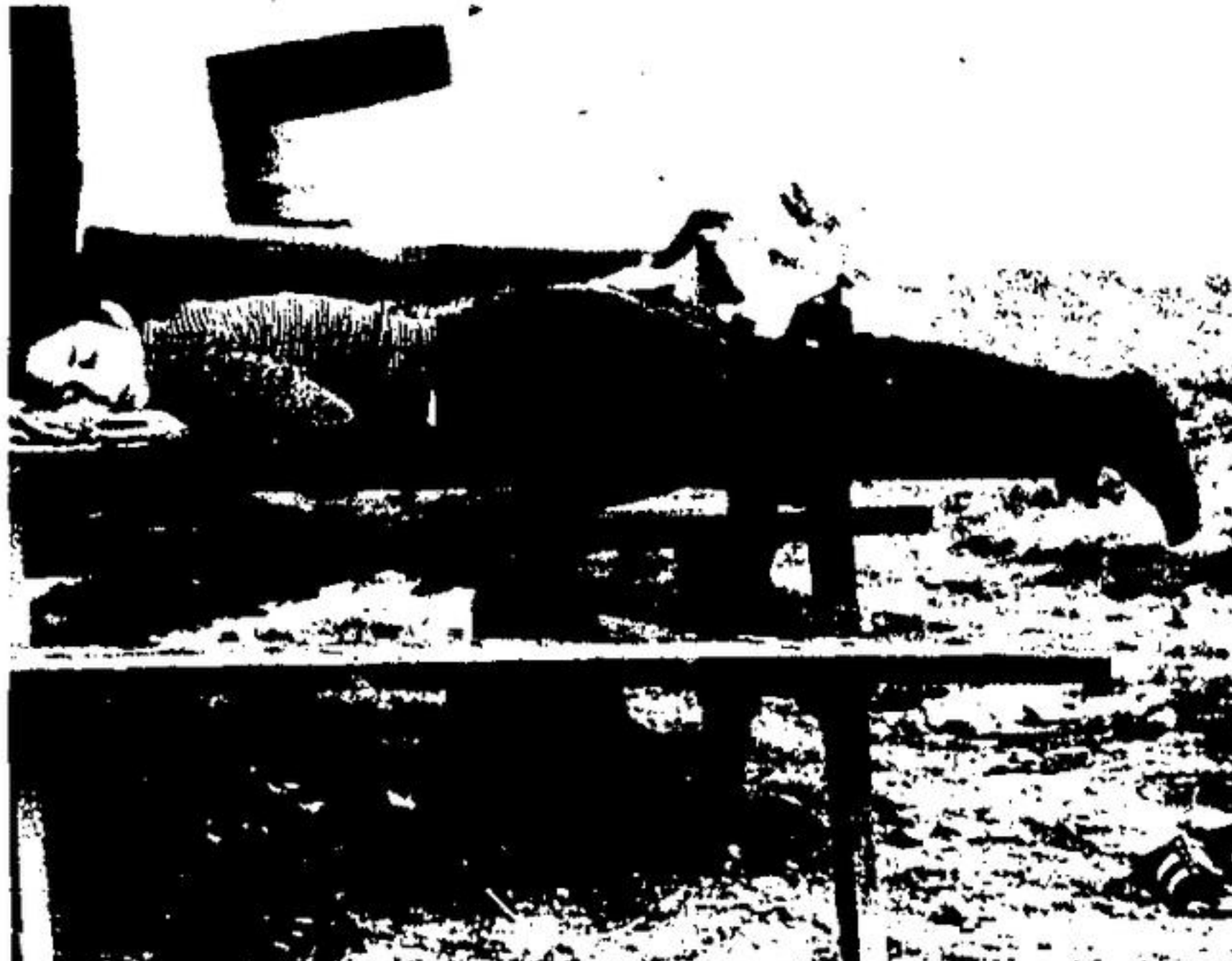
