When Reeve Dan Matheson asked for examples of what use a LIP grant could be to the township, examples were given: transportation services for M.S. victims, trips for senior citizens, construction of commercial buildings (employment wages but not purchase of materials), environment concerns, maintenance.

"But" Dr. Philbrook emphasized, "this is a one time only thing, the project to be done in ONE year."

Council began speculating what could be done with a small grant of \$10,000 to \$15,000 listing the hiring of men to clear scrub from intersections, to catch beaver flooding farm land, or to erect road signs designating line and concession numbers.
