Halton Hills residents among those on strike

Many Halton Hills residents are included in the almost 1,800 workers who walked off the job Friday at de Havilland Aircraft, Downsview.

The workers went on strike to press their demands for a new contract. Their last contract expired on June 30. Union officials said negotiations have been going on for five months but progress didn't begin until a strike deadline was set last week.

De Havilland's latest offer was a five per cent increase during the first year of the contract and three per cent each of the next two years. The increases would be calculated from the basic plant wage of \$4.40 an hour and a cost of living adjustment would be included in the package.

The union says they want cost of living adjustments of 91 cents an hour the first year of the contract.

Union officials are predicting a short strike at the government owned aircraft plant.

Driver ed. fee up by '10

Inflation has struck again forcing Halton Board of Education to raise the fee for driver education courses by \$10. It was announced at Thursday's board meeting that the cost for driver education will jump from \$60 to \$70. Superintendent of Instruction Orié Gilmore said increased costs for gasoline and insurance were among the factors forcing the fee boost. Trustee Bill Lawson wondered if there was much difference in the cost of running the program where students had use of a driving simulator, but Gilmore said there wasn't much difference in cost to the board.
