**Halton-Burl. candidates**

It's official now—voters in Halton-Burlington riding will find three names on the ballot in the provincial election Thursday, Sept. 18.

Official nomination day for candidates was Thursday, Sept. 4 and the Progressive Conservative Gary Dawkins of Acton, New Democratic Party's William A. Johnson of Milton and Liberal Julian Reed of Norval were officially nominated. There were no "dark horse" candidates leaping into the race at the last minute.

The new Oakville riding has a fourth candidate, however, in addition to the three already announced candidates. Mrs. Christina Morris of Toronto has decided to oppose the Liberal, PC and NDP candidates as a candidate for the North American Labor Party, described as a pro-Soviet Marxist group. On the official list of candidates released by The Canadian Press of Friday, she is described as an independent.

Mrs. Morris says her party is more militant and radical

than the Communist Party of Canada, which she summed up as a group of "Saturday night socialists."

Former Halton East MPP Jim Snow, Minister of Government Services in the Davis cabinet for the past eight years, is the PC candidate in Oakville. For the Liberals, the standard-bearer is regional councillor and former Oakville mayor Mac Anderson. NDP candidate is Doug Black, a lawyer.

In Burlington-South incumbent PC member George Kerr, currently Ontario's solicitor-general, is opposed by Bill Brown of the NDP and Don Pennell of the Liberal party.

Halton Region used to be divided on an east-west basis with the two old ridings represented by Snow and Kerr. This election sees Oakville and the southern portion of Burlington forming two separate ridings. The remainder of Halton—the north part of Burlington, Milton, and Halton Hills forms a new riding known as Halton-Burlington.

**Add 1,500 after enumeration**

About 1,500 people who were missed by Halton-Burlington riding enumerators in the riding-wide voter count

have since made sure they will have a right to vote Sept. 18, riding returning officer Roy Coulter of Milton reported this week.

Deadline for anyone who is not on the voters' lists is today, Wednesday Sept. 10.

Now 39,000

Enumerators came up with 37,411 names but the additional 1,500 means the riding vote list should top 39,000 names, he said. The number of names added by revising the lists was described as "enormous".

Officials said many were still away on holidays during the August enumeration, so were missed by the enumeration staff.

Candidates are busy on the campaign trail as the election day, Sept. 18 approaches.

**Advance polls**

Advance polls are to be held in five locations across Halton-Burlington riding this Friday, Saturday and Monday to accommodate voters who may be away on election day, Thursday Sept. 18.

Returning Officer Roy Coulter this week urged all persons who feel there's a chance they might be out of town on business or holidays on Sept. 18 to take advantage of the advance polls.

"These people should vote early just to be safe," he said.

The only formality involved in voting early is that the voter is asked by the poll clerk for a reason, he said.

Workers vote  
As well, election workers such as scrutineers, poll clerks and deputy returning officers are expected to vote at the advance polls.

Coulter said ballot boxes used in the advance polls are not opened until the evening of Sept. 18 when the election is over.

Times of the advance polls are: Friday, Sept. 12, 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.; Saturday, Sept. 13, 12 Noon to 9 p.m.; Monday, Sept. 15, 12 Noon to 9 p.m.

**Asks candidates give views**

In a letter to all provincial candidates in the current election campaign, Ken Campbell, chairman of Renaissance Ontario, has asked that the party leaders as well as each of the candidates to "meet their responsibilities to the Ontario electorate by declaring themselves on this issue:

"What are you willing to do to provide alternate education for those parents dissatisfied with the present philosophy of education in Ontario public schools?"

Citing article 26 of the United Nations declaration of hu-

man rights, which states, "Parents have a prior right to choose the kind of education that shall be given to their children," Campbell charges that that right is being denied Ontario parents in the present public educational system. On March 10, in a brief to the Ontario cabinet, Renaissance recommended "that the Ministry establish a commission to study the feasibility of the establishment in Ontario of a public educational system based on free pluralism supported by a voucher system."

According to Campbell's letter, Renaissance finds

scandalous the unresponsiveness of Mr. Davis' cabinet to this humane proposal for

"correcting the present gross violation of the civil rights of all Ontario parents."

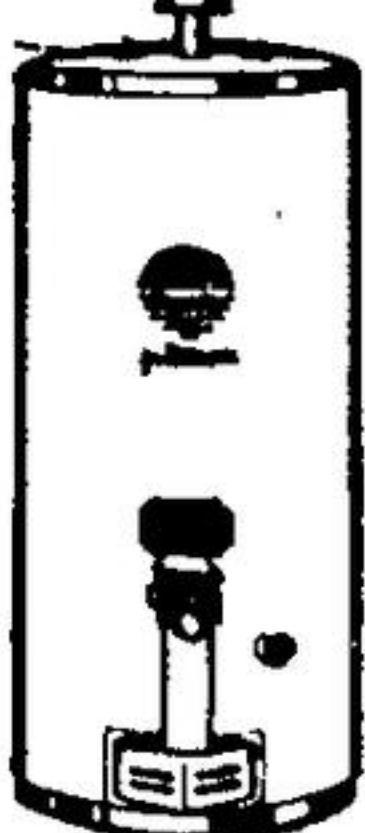
