PIONEER VILLAGE




CLAN DONALD HOUSE 1850. Being erected by the Grand River Branch of the Clan Donald Society of Canada. From Puslinch Township, on the Currie farm, restoration represents an early pioneer Scottish home.

DOON PIONEER VILLAGE, is located west from interchange 34 on Highway 401. Buildings including a pioneer church, blacksmith's and cooper's shops, a general store and the Peter McArthur log cabin, are open to the public. A great variety of historical material relating to the pioneer community in this part of the province is displayed.



THE GINGERBREAD HOUSE. This house originally built on the EBY FAMILY property, was lived in by the Seibert family and donated by the City of Kitchener 1964 from Madison Avenue. The house has undergone many changes as time progressed. Because of the Gingerbread ornamentation and outside construction it represents an 1896 Victorian residence. The central hall upstairs displays clothing, dolls and the story of the green Santa Claus known as WEIHNACHTSMANN.
