Guest speaker at United Church

The Rev. James F. Seunarine will be the guest speaker this Sunday at the Trinity United Church, according to the Rev. Eric Nelson.

Rev. Seunarine is the Associate Secretary responsible for Research and Education in Interfaith Relations and International Understanding in the United Church of Canada's Division of World Outreach. His job entails everything from freedom movements to the position of Christianity in a pluralistic world.

He was born in Trinidad in 1921 of East Indian parents. His father was a Hindu who converted while translating for Christian missionaries.

Rev. Seunarine took his Doctoral studies in Princeton, New Jersey, while, at the same time, he did a year's research in his ancestral home of India. At Victoria College, University of Toronto, he took his Arts and Theology degrees. For two years Rev. Seunarine was in Jamaica as a professor at United Theological College of the West Indies.

His main field has been education. While a Presbyterian minister in Trinidad, he became secretary of the denominational school board, administering 72 schools. Later he was principal of Naparima College, the mission secondary school, with 600 pupils. He was also

principal of St. Andrew's Theological College in Trinidad.

As a church leader he served in many roles, including that of Moderator for

the Caribbean Assembly of Reformed Churches.
