Georgetown Geminis continue to be the talk of the Central OHA Junior "B" league in their first season of competition. Saturday night in front of 653 paid customers at Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena the first year Geminis stretched their unbeaten streak to four games with a 5-2 win over the Dixie Ventures.
 Written off by some clubs as "a bunch of overage juveniles", Geminis have now got the same teams taking them as serious contenders for the league pennant. The Georgetown club has three wins and a tie in four games and is sitting in second place behind the Burlington Mohawks in the seven team loop.
 For the fourth straight game, Geminis were outshot Saturday, but goalie Rick Tomkinson made several key saves to limit the Ventures to just two goals. Tomkinson has a respectable 3.00 goals against average for the first four league games.
 Leaders for Georgetown in Saturday's win were line of Kevin Reeks, Doug Barnes and Charlie Knoepfl. Reeks had a goal and three assists, Barnes two goals and an assist and Knoepfl the first Georgetown goal.
