**Last of generation
R. McEnery dies**

Robert Akitt McEnery a lifelong resident and last remaining family member of his generation in Erin township, passed away at Guelph General Hospital, September 29.

Son of the late David Fife McEnery and Katherine Akitt he was born in Halton and attended Blue Mountain school.

As a young man he lived in Galt where he married Margaret Kentner of Ballinafad. They returned to the Ballinafad area to farm on the 8th line then moved to a property on the 7th line and

No. 5 sideroad Erin which they farmed for 50 years. When they sold their farm in 1971 Mr. and Mrs. McEnery moved to Acton where he resided until the time of his death.

"Bobbe" as he was known to his friends, was a lifelong member of Ballinafad United church, where he was an elder and choir member.

In May of this year Mr. and Mrs. McEnery celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary at the Waldie Nursing Home where they have resided for the past year.

Mr. McEnery is survived by his wife, Margaret, his grandson, David, and three great grandchildren, Rick, Wayne and David McEnery. A daughter-in-law, Mrs. Kay Alger resides in Hamilton. He was predeceased by his son, Arnold, his five brothers and four sisters.

Constable Barry Holland of the Halton Regional Police Force was formerly with the Metro Toronto Force. While he was there, the Queen of England and Prime Minister Trudeau visited the city, and he was assigned to escort Her Majesty wherever she went. As Const. Holland looks back on his police career, he would regard this as one of the more interesting assignments, although not a highlight.

Ten years ago, the 25-year-old Constable moved from Vancouver to Ontario. Three years ago he joined the Toronto police force, where he spent two years. A six month hiatus in 21 countries abroad provided an eventful holiday before Const. Holland joined the Halton Regional Police last August. On September 1 he began his duties in Acton when the Regional Police expanded into the town.

He states the major difference between working for Halton and Metro is that in

Toronto investigations happen more frequently, which would be expected. Besides being a policeman, Const. Holland is a swimming instructor and examiner. Scuba diving is also practised by the aquatic-minded bachelor.

All sports, including water-skiing, are on his list of hobbies as well as photography. If not in the water, Const. Holland is in the sky. He has a student pilot's licence and is continuing his lessons.

Commuting from Mississauga each day, the policeman prefers the four to 12 or the 12 to eight a.m. shifts. Like a few of his colleagues, he doesn't like to wake up too early in the day.

Const. Holland likes the work he does, but if he ever decided to change careers, he has a number of options.
