
The Ministry ensured that the October cheques to gains pensioners were delivered before the mail strike and is currently finalizing plans for distribution of November cheques. Information concerning distribution of these cheques will be released by

Nov. 15. Home buyers' grant application forms can be dropped off at any Ministry of Revenue office. When the grant has been approved, the Ministry will tell recipients by telephone where to pick up their cheques.

Through dealers . Application forms for retail sales tax rebates on the purchase of new cars will be completed at the car dealership as usual. Arrangements will be made to have these forms delivered directly to the Ministry of Revenue, "We are seeking the co-operation of dealers by arranging to return cheques to dealers for pickup by applicants. In those instances where the above arrangements are inconvenient, the Ministry will contact the applicant by telephone.

Returns and payments for retail sales tax, fuel taxes, corporations tax and succession duty may be delivered to any of the Ministry of Revenue offices or any other Ontario Government office If no revenue office is in your municipality.
