An aerial ladder will be left in the town's capital budget forecast for the next five years.

Councillor Ern Hyde tried to have it removed from the forecast, saying such an item could pose many problems for the department.

Councillor Les Duby emphasized the inclusion in the capital forecast was just seeking approval of the financing if and when the town decided to buy one. "We are not discussing the purchase of an aerial ladder right now," he stated.

Councillor Roy Booth said the reasons for including it in the forecast are valid. He claimed that fire in a large industry such as Gage and Neilson would be hard to fight without an aerial ladder.
