## Baha'is observe anniversary date

On November 28, the Baha'is of the Halton Hills community will commemorate the anniversary of the Ascension of Abdu'l-Baha in 1921.

Servant of the Glory), was the son of Baha'u'llah, Prophet-founder of the Baha' Faith. He was appointed by Baha'u'llah as the authorized interpreter of His Writings, to whom all Baha'is must turn for instruction and guidance.

In New York City, on Nov. 26, 1912, Abdu'l-Baha announced to the Baha'is that He had been appointed the Centre of the Covenant by His Father, and this day is now known as the Day of the Covenant. Abdu'l-Baha shared Baha'u'llah's exile, remaining a prisoner until 1908, when, as a result of the Young Turk Revolution, He was released from His confinement. Establishing His residence in Haifa, He embarked soon after on His three-year journey to Egypt, Europe and North America, in the course of which time He stayed in Montreal at the home of Sutherland and May Maxwell, now a Baha'i shrine.

Abdu'l-Baha is buried on Mt. Carmel in Haifa, Israel.

## NOTICE OF APPLICATION BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS TO DISPENSE WITH A VOTE OF THE ELECTORS

TAKE NOTICE THAT:

- The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board for approval of the following works: the acquisition and the development of land and the erection of buildings and structures thereon for municipal purposes and the reconstruction of or the making of additions to existing municipal buildings at an estimated cost of \$300,000, to be raised by the sale of debentures payable out of the general rate over a period not exceeding 20 years.
- Application will be made to the Ontario Municipal Board for an order to dispense with the assent of the electors to the undertaking of the said works. Any ratepayer may, within twenty-one days after the first publication of this notice, send by post prepaid to the Clerk Administrator of the Town of Halton Hills at the address given below a notice in writing stating his objection to such approval and the grounds of such objection.
- The Ontario Municipal Board may order pursuant to the statute that the assent of the electors shall not be required and may approve of the said works, but before doing so it may appoint a time and place for a public hearing when any objections will be considered.
