Life for Terry O'Connor is a whirlwind. O'Connor, a former Halton MP, former Halton riding PC Association president, former assistant to Provincial PC Cabinet Minister Allan Lawrence and presently a practicing lawyer, has just finished a cross country tour of Canada.

The purpose of the mission was to promote the chances of colleague Flora Mac-Donald winning the federal Progressive Conservative leadership race in February.

For the second time in recent years O'Connor has set up house in the nation's capital. Last time it was as an MP - this time as a campaign manager.

O'Connor stole a few hours from a gruelling schedule to attend the Halton and Halton East riding meeting Thursday

O'Connor and MacDonald swept across the country, hitting every major city in about three weeks.

O'Connor was questioned on what impact the publicity would have on Wagner's chances to lead the party. "I think it will have a real impact, unless he discusses the dates and openly discusses the whole matter-even turning over the papers for the trust fund.

place, a Toronto newspaper reported how a group of individuals had contributed to a fund to cover some business debts Cafik had encountered.

While there was no definite accusation of wrongdoing, the news ran through the Royal York Hotel where the conference was held. Some people credited the revelation of the financial arrangement as quashing Cafik's chance at the leadership.
