Jets burned the Aeros in a 7-2 match.

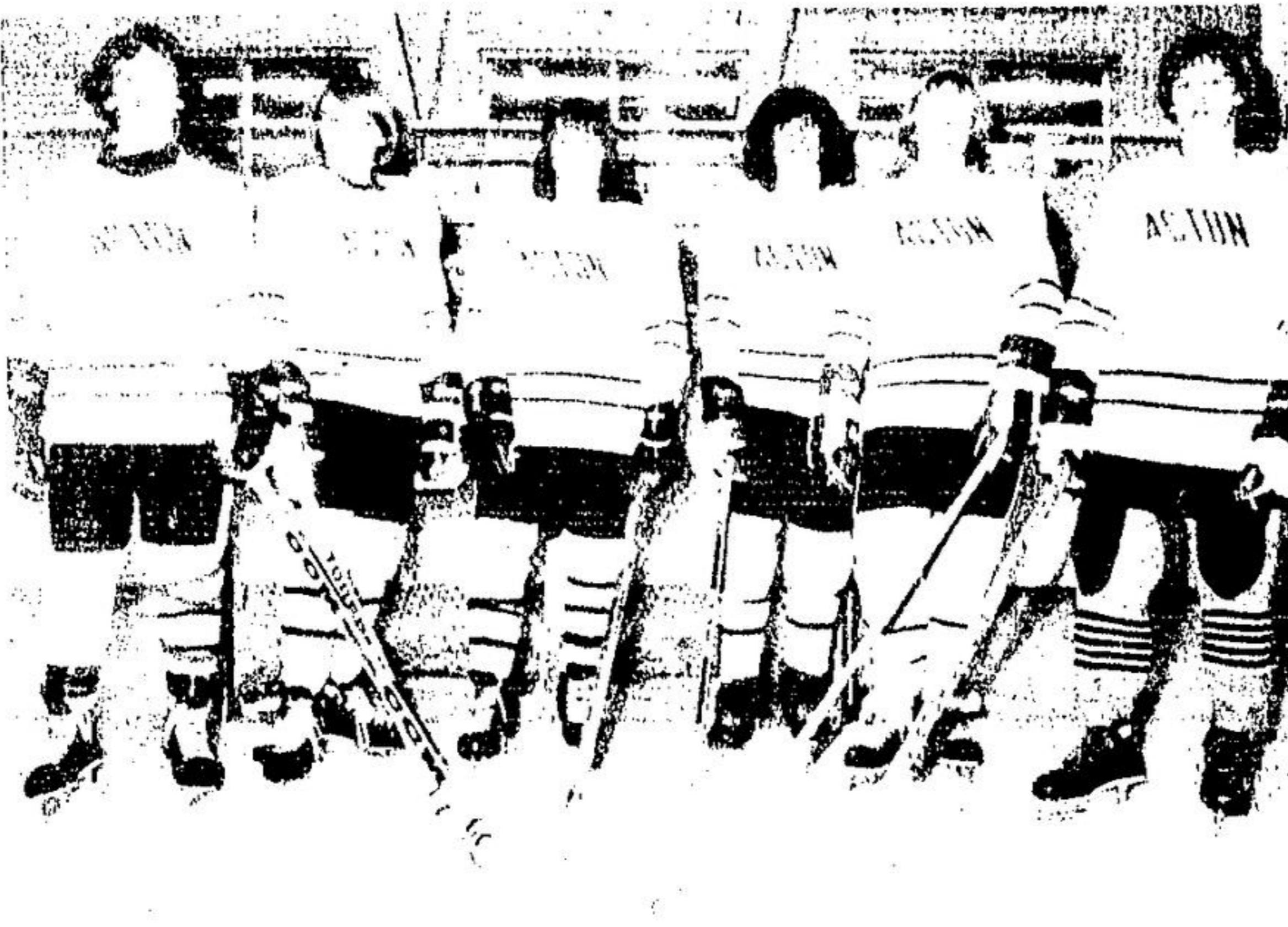
