Last month Rev. Camp. !! sent a letter to various officials charging that at a meeting of Halton Home and School Association Dr. Meyer blamed the teaching of traditional Judaco-Christian moral values in school for the first and second world wars. In a letter to board Chair-

man Judy Alexander he "requested a hearing before the board this Thursday so that we might have the basic Conadian right to trial before being condemned . . . or at least, having been condemned without a trial, - a before being hearing

abuse in the deliberate misinformation of the public." The board also said it wouldn't tolerate any longer the abuse of open access to the board by a very small group of people. The board was referring to Renaissance's many dealings with the trustees. Renaissance takes issue with being referred to as a small group of people when they claim a membership of over 800

people in Halton. Rev. Campbell says he is amazed that during the three weeks the board's special committee investigated his allegations against Dr. Meyer he was never consulted or questioned.

He says the fact-finding committee ignored two lelters sent to the board by Betty Hansford and Betty Reade which substantiated his charge against Dr. Meyer.

According to the two letters Dr. Meyer supposedly made the statement Rev. Campbell finds objectionable in response to a question from Mrs. Reade after the Home and School Council meeting had finished. Campbell said the charge of dishonesty on his part and the board's inadequate fact-finding investigation "would be amusing if it wasn't so tragic."
