North Halton Sports Camp set to go in August at Alcott

North Halton Sports Camp, a four week school which will combine professional instruction in hockey basics with professional or qualified instruction in wrestling, tennis, swimming, soccer and football will take over Gordon Alcott Memorial Arena next August 2-27.

The application of Pete Pomeroy of Georgetown to operate the camp was out recently over two others also presented to Halton Hills Council. Last summer Howard and Gerry Murphy operated a two week hockey school here, also in August.

"We've looked at the programs of all the hockey schools we knew of and tried to lay out something which will give youngsters some-

thing for their money," Pomeroy told this paper. "We hope to have the best hockey school in this part of the country."

So far, Danny Gruen of the WHA Cleveland Crusaders and NHL linesman Ron Finn have agreed to instruct at the school, while Bob McKay of the Georgetown District High physical education staff will handle dry land training and instruction on the accompanying sports. Co-ordinators of on the ice activities will be Paul Robinson and Bob Tost, coach and manager respectively of the Junior "B" Gemins.

According to Pomeroy, Gruen, who has relatives living in Georgetown is anxious to take an active part in instructing, rather than just have his name attached to the school. Finn, recognized among pro officials for his skating ability has previous experience instructing at hockey schools.

Pomeroy is presently in the midst of negotiations to hire a power skating instructor.

The camp will include four one week sessions at a cost of \$60 per week for each boy or
