## Swords downed by Mitchell but defeat Milverton

The Swords split their weekend action dropping a 3-1 decision in Mitchell, but ending 1975 with a win against Milverton Sunday in Ontario Hockey Association Intermediate action.

Dale Fisher had a four goal weekend for the Swords. He was the only Acton player to score against Mitchell with his second period effort. Mitchell banged in all its goals in the first period, and outshot the visitors 43-39.

It was a different story Sunday. Swords took a sweet 9-4 win from the Milverton 4-Wheelers, the club which just

one week earlier handed Acton a 9-2 Christmas present loss.

In the first period the teams exchanged goals, with Acton taking and retaking the lead until Dale Fisher gave Swords a 3-2 lead which Milverton failed to tie.

Ben Doell opened the scoring on a play from Brian Hurley at the 3:56 mark.

Next Dale Fisher scored the first of his three goals after Milverton matched Doell's goal. The 4-Wheelers returned once more in the first period to tie the score.

In the second period Bill Fields waited just 1:35 seconds to score his first of two goals, with Gary Tallifer assisting. One minute later Doell stole the puck in Milverton's end and fired it into the net. Milverton got one goal back in the second frame, but Acton led 5-3.

Twenty-five seconds into the final period, Pete Morrison flicked the red light on a pass from Fields.

Fields again assisted on a goal this time he set up Fisher's third of the evening.

Milverton managed to get one back and narrow the

margin to 7-4.

Doell joined forces with Taillefer to feed Brian Hurley a pass, and the Sword captain tucked it away between Milverton's pipes.

Milverton got sloppy inside Sword territory and Fields intercepted a pass and scored on a breakaway to end off the slaughter.

The scorers for Milverton were Jerry Rozendal, Bill Quipp, Paul Mitchell and Dave Bowen.
