# Response is considered good for town recreation programs

Response was generally good for the Community Recreation Programs sponsored by the Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department.

Recreation program co-ordinator John Cooper said he was very pleased with the response to some programs, but disappointed with others.

**Agriculture**  
One of his biggest disappointments is the Theatre Arts program. Mr. Cooper said some people say there is a lack of cultural programs in

Acton and the course is one way of introducing it to the town. The co-ordinator said the program is a cultural subject with an "excellent teacher".

The instructor Ann Joyce, now lives in Stewarttown, but has acted in England and Hong Kong. She belongs to one or two Toronto acting companies and teaches for the Brampton Recreation Department and the Bramalea Children's Theatre.

There are still many openings left in this program which will include voice, expressive movement and improvisation. Students will also write their own short plays.

Many courses have had good response, and have no openings available. Gymnastics at the Acton high school is the only course in the town filled.

However, Pineview school courses have received overwhelming response, and many of them are full. Women's exercises will be taught by Mrs. Kunicia. Betty Ann Dupuis will be the head instructor with the children's gymnastic program, which will involve tumbling and basic apparatus.

Kindergym, also at Pineview school and also full, will be a program of tumbling, games, arts and crafts and songs.

Children's gymnastic in Speyside is full, but there are still many openings in the cake decorating course in the same school.
