

**Swords vs Flyers**

**Two goal lead, not good enough**

The Swords played what must be their best home game of the season Saturday night, nearly topping the highly rated Fergus Flyers. At one point the Swords looked like winners with an early two goal lead in the last period, but the Flyers pressed in the final minutes, to take the game 7-6.

That game was a turn around from the last time the two teams met here. Flyers dropped the Swords for a 13-4 loss in Intermediate "C" OHA action. It was a different story Saturday night when the Swords forechecked the Fergus forwards to hamper the Flyers' attempts to attack. When the visitors got into the neutral zone, Swords slowed their advance with body checks.

The muscle tactics worked well into the early part of the third period when the Swords had built up a two goal lead.

Flyers returned to score the winning goal with less than three minutes to play in the game. Swords pulled goaltender Rick Bonnette, but failed to capitalize with the extra attacker.

Ben Doell led the Sword scoring with a pair of goals and a strong forechecking game.

Fergus got off to an early lead at the 45 second mark of the first period when Handy Fleming scored the first of his three goals. Nevin drew first blood for the Swords shortly after on assists from Bob Jarrett and Dan Arbie.

Arbie collected four assists in the game.

The teams exchanged goals once more in the first frame with Dale Fisher notching a marker for Acton. Bill Fields got the assist.

The second period also ended with the teams tied, 3-3, after Doell pulled the trigger for the first of his pair.

Swords went two up with goals just 16 seconds apart by captain Brian Hurley and Doell. Arbie figured in both markers, and Hurley assisted on Doell's.

S. Gould connected for Swords final marker, one which tied the game 6-6. The winning goal came off the stick of J. Cunningham at the 17:05 mark of the final period.

Other Fergus scorers were Sandy Fleming, Jim Kurtz and H. Hesser.

In accordance with By-Law Number 74-45 and its amendments, every owner of a Dog on or before the 15th day of February in each year, or within seven (7) days of becoming the owner of a dog after the 15th day of February, shall register each dog with the collector and apply to him for a license and tag for each dog.

**LICENSE FEES ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1. Female or Male Dog \$8.00
- 2. Spayed Female or Neutered Male \$5.00
- 3. Kennel License \$25.00

Every person who fails to comply with Section 2 or Section 7 of these By-laws is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine of not more than \$10.00 exclusive of costs, and every such fine shall be recoverable under the provisions of the Summary Convictions Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 450.

A license may be obtained by applying to the Municipal Offices of the Town of Halton Hills, located at 36 Main Street South, Georgetown and 40 Mill Street East, Acton.

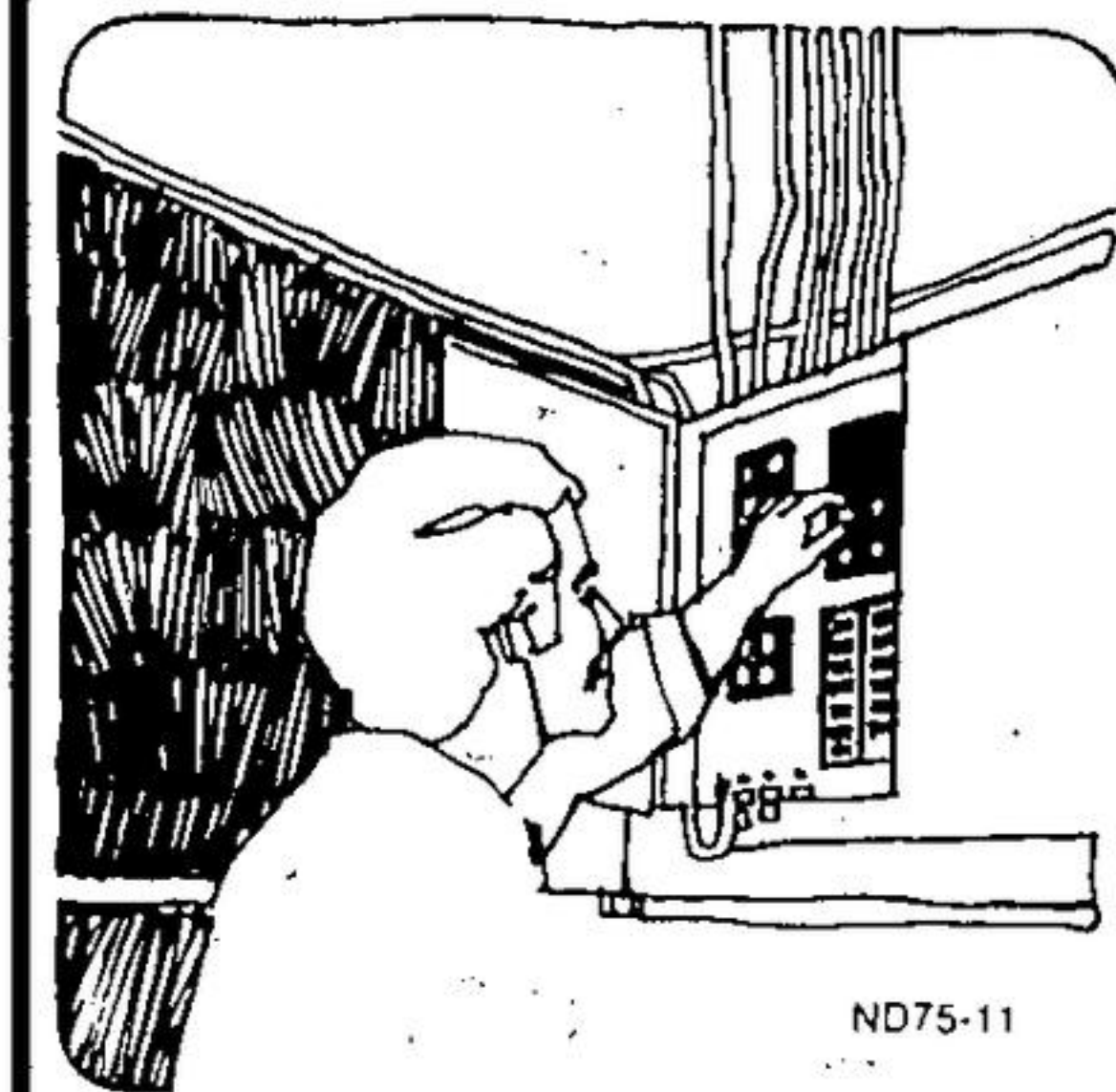

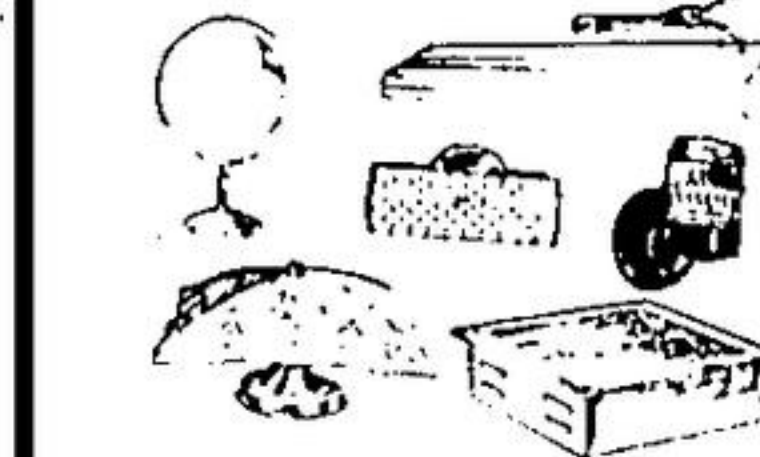

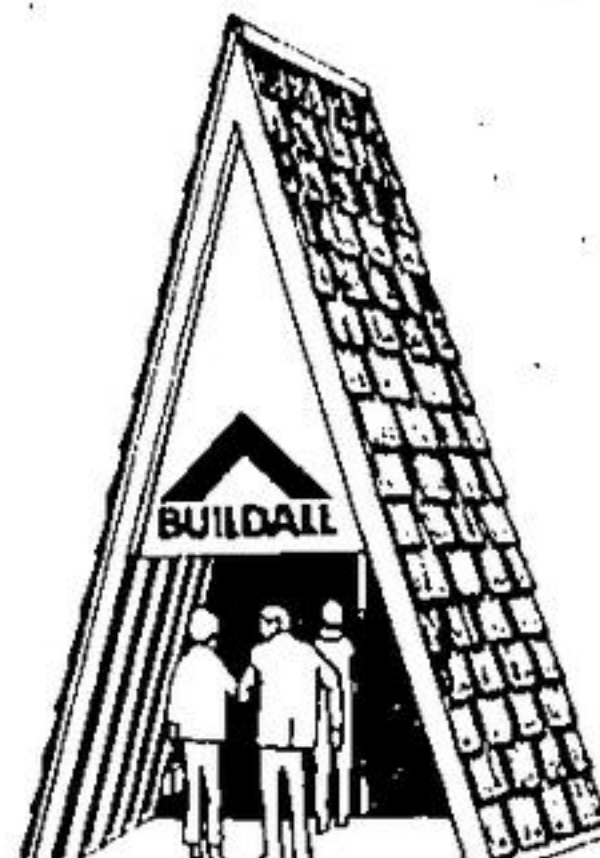
