Water Safety Service suggests that when walking across the ice you carry your own personal rescue equipment. A pole carried horizontally can help prevent a complete plunge through the ice. Or carry a penknife in your coat pocket. Should you fall in, it could be driven into the ice ahead to pull yourself out.
