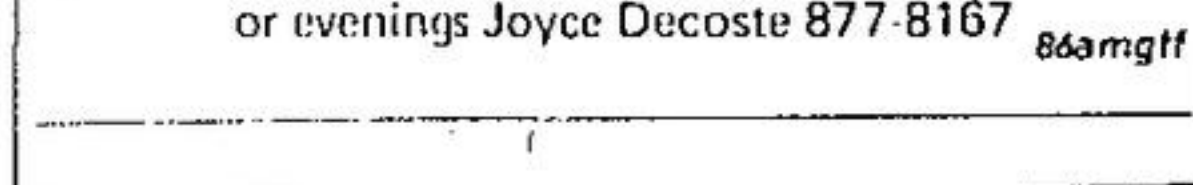

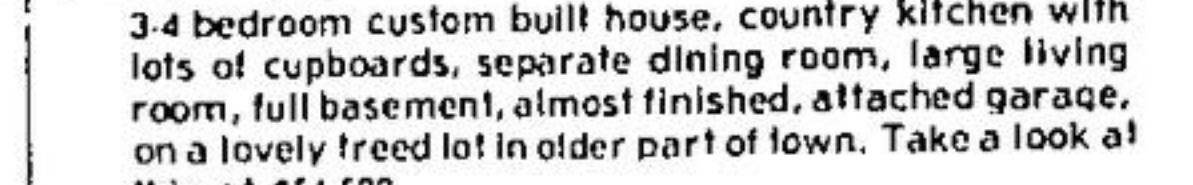

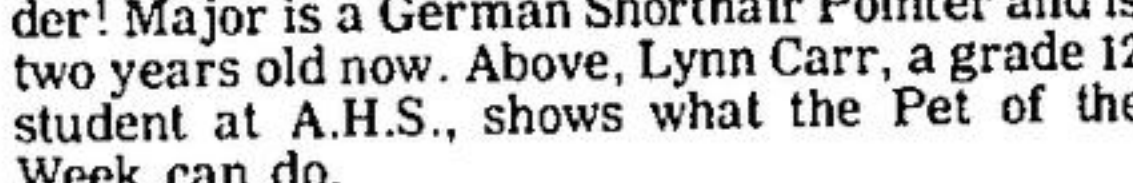

I am very pleased to announce that three of our staff members have just successfully completed their Red Cross Royal Life Instructor course in Guelph this weekend. Last week I promised a winter safety rule so here goes:

The Canadian Red Cross Water Safety Service suggests that when walking across the ice you carry your own personal rescue equipment. A pole carried horizontally can help prevent a complete plunge through the ice. Or carry a penknife in your coat pocket. Should you fall in, it could be driven into the ice ahead to pull yourself out. A length of cord passed behind your neck and through your coat sleeves with a six-inch spike at each end could be used to draw yourself forward by plunging the spikes alternately into the ice. If you're wearing mittens, freeze them to the ice and use these to help you out of the hole. Remember, if you're not sure the ice is safe, keep off.

I.C.G. to receive grant for research

The Independent Citizens Group will receive a grant of \$1500 from the East Garafraxa Township Council.

The money will be used for further research.

Reeve Lorne Brown and several councillors from the Township attended a recent meeting in Orton village church hall at which chairman Wayne Tucker discussed the Environmental Hearing Board report on the proposed Hydro Corridor from Colbeck to Limehouse.

Mr Brown told the assembled citizens that his council had unanimously passed a resolution to oppose the corridor and had stated their support for the ICG in requesting an independent study of the total corridor.

Residents expressed concern about the environmental effect of a Hydro corridor through an area where the headwaters of several rivers are located. They felt that the local water supply might be adversely affected if the water table levels were disturbed.

It was evident that they also felt that the research done by Ontario Hydro prior to the enquiry of the Environmental Hearing Board was incomplete and outdated. The name of the

Georgetown arena closed

The old arena in Georgetown was ordered closed by Halton Hills Council Monday.

Future use of the arena depends on a report to be prepared by consulting engineers and the recreation director.

"The arena is not condemned by any means, we are closing it for safety reasons, only on a temporary basis", Mayor Tom Hill said.

Council asked a consulting firm for an estimate of an immediate remedy.
