

(Bottom Picture) The Old Iron Horse rounds the bend passing some finely detailed buildings, which were scratch built by John.




(Top Picture) Another Acton railroader displays his models of steampowered engines as they sit outside the roundhouse.

(Bottom Picture) The main feature of this railway was the fact it has only engines that were run on Canadian Railroads. One sample of this is the





