The Sabres came back from a two to zip deficit to tie Alliston in the second frame.

Don Richard opened the Sabre scoring with a power play goal which he knocked

into the Hornet net with a baseball like swing that connected. Sabre captain Charlie McCrae passed the puck to Richard from Kevin Marcoux.

Jeff Shields, playing in his second game with the Sabres, carried the puck from a break delivered by defenceman Perry Caputo. Shields put George Arlem into the clear for Acton's second goal.

Effort
McCrae got the tying goal on an unassisted effort with less than six minutes to play in the game.

Rick Owens scored the winning goal for Alliston at the 6:01 mark of the first OT frame. Other Hornet scorers were Paul O'Leary, Doug Pursiainen and Rick Plourdes.

Shields not only impressed us, but according to the Alliston team he just about drove them crazy with tenacious checking, said manager Campbell. "As far as I'm concerned, he's a sure bet for next year's team," he said.

Late in the first period Sabre Steve Buchanan took ten stitches in the right eye lid from a high stick.

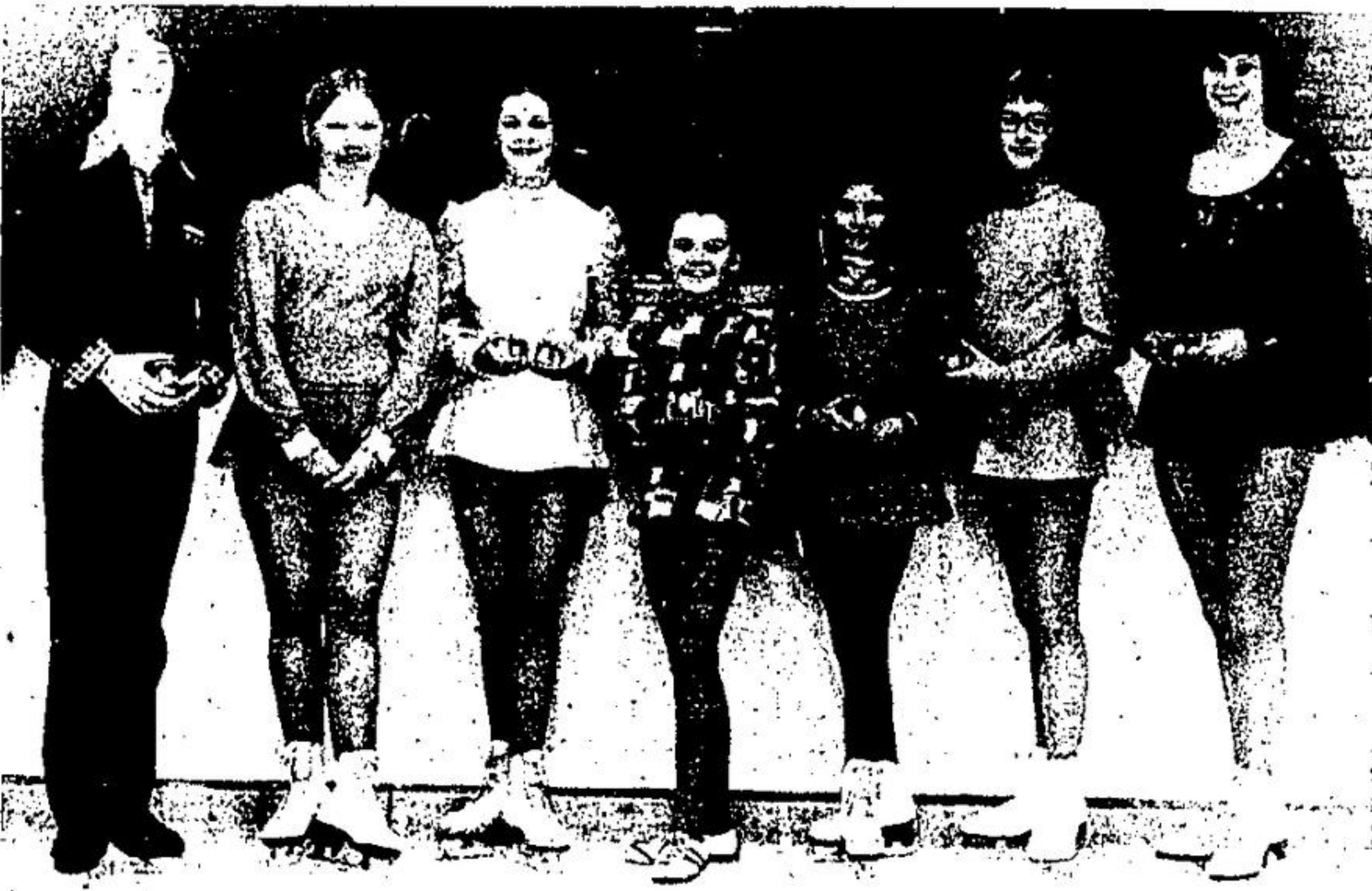
The team took 12 players to Alliston. Midget players would have been added to the roster if they were not tied up in a basketball tournament.
