Powys objects to region control of Children's Aid

Despite strong objections by Councillor Marjorie Powys Halton regional council decided last Wednesday to proceed with an investigation of the possible advantages of the region taking over responsibility of the Children's Aid Society.
Ms. Powys couldn't believe the administration committee's suggestion in light of the fact it is a chore each year to find six councillors who will sit on the Children's Aid Society Board of Directors. Then she said councillors proceed to compile a "shameful" attendance record.
She said there has never been more than two of the six councillors on the board of directors at any one meeting and noted some never showed up all year.
"This is a waste of staff's time and it would be absurd for us to take the Children's

Aid Society over," she declared.
She said no level of government would be able to do as good a job as the over 80 volunteers working over 400 hours a month do with the Children's Aid Society, Mrs. Powys added agencies taken over by the region previously haven't exactly been "roaring successes."
"She said in light of the fact the councillors' poor attendance record is a poorly kept secret, any move by the region to even consider taking over the Children's Aid Society would mean "we will forfeit respect we can ill afford to lose."
Defending the administration committee's recommendation, Councillor Carl Erikson said the whole idea was simply to look at the pros and cons of the idea. "We just want to see if there would be cost savings and so advantages to the children if we took it over," he added.
He said the whole idea could be dropped after a bit of examination.
Council decided to proceed with meetings between the Children's Aid Society board of directors and regional officials.

Region home of retired

Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett is concerned about the region becoming a home for retired municipal employees.
At last Wednesday's Halton region council meeting he complained about the transfer of a Burlington survey crew to the regional payroll.
He noted both Oakville and Burlington have decided no new employees will be hired and positions held by people retiring won't be filled. He added in some cases people might be let go.
"I don't want the region to turn into an old folks home for Burlington workers," Barrett said.
Councillor Jack Rafitis explained another survey crew was needed for the region and the works department didn't want to hire consultants to do the job. He added the move was a transfer of workers which has been planned for months.

Politics holding pay cut

Councillor Terry Mannell says staff is being pressured by councillors to delay bringing a by-law to council which will cut regional councillors' pay 10 per cent.
Mannell raised the question at last Wednesday's Halton regional council meeting and asked why the by-law wasn't on the agenda.
"I was informed it arrived back from the legal department too late to be placed on the agenda but will appear on the March 3 council agenda for final approval."
"I have heard rumors political pressure is being placed on the staff to hold it up. Is there any truth to the rumor?" Mannell wondered.
Chairman Allan Masson denied there was truth in it. He noted if it is approved it will be retroactive to the start of the year.
On a close vote in January the councillors decided to chop \$850 from their \$8,500 salary.
