# Top gymnast lands hard

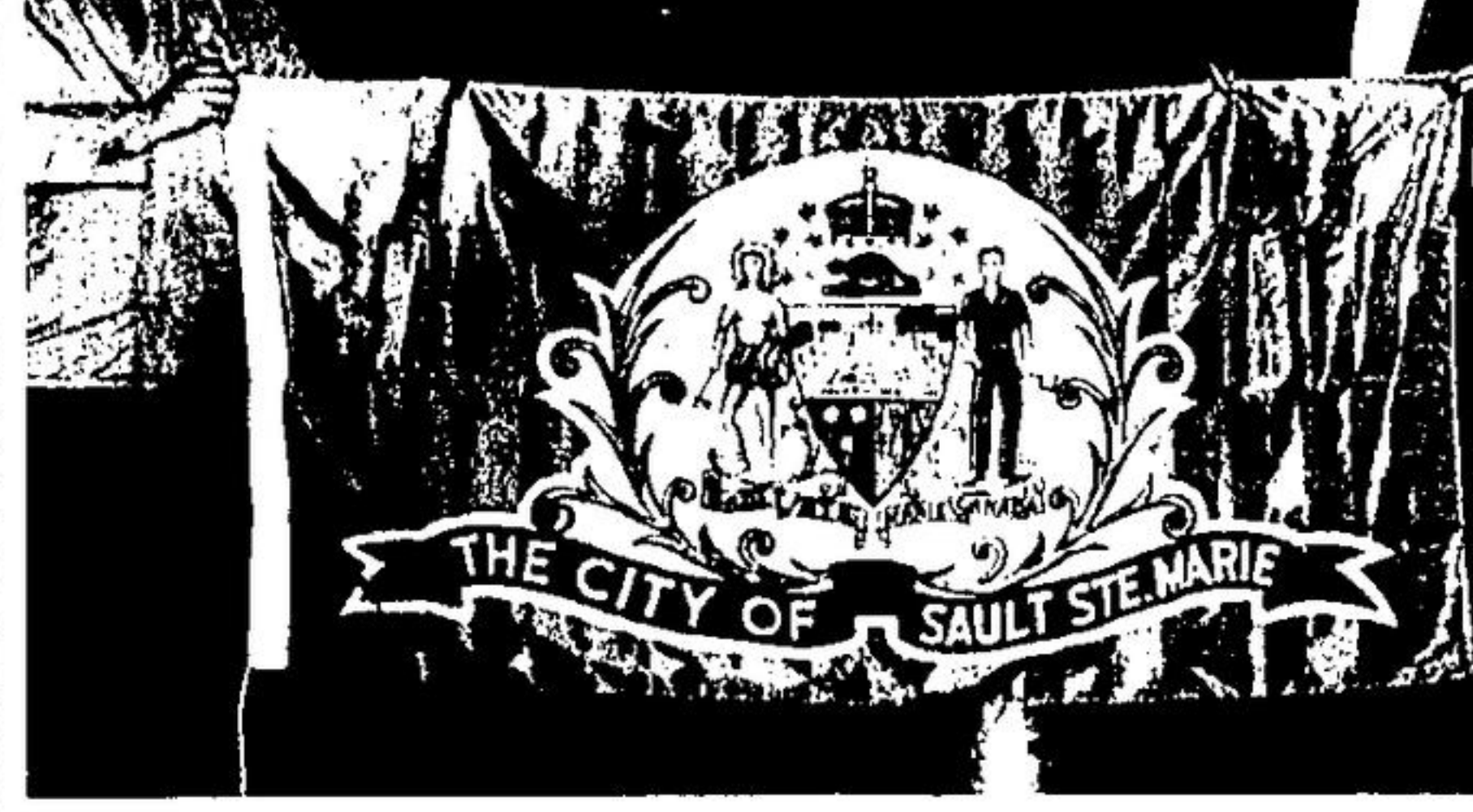
