Color breeds in horses have come into their own during the past 25 years—Palomino, Buckskin, Pinto and Paint, and Appaloosa breeds have developed into fine conformation breeds of great popularity.

When producing coloured foals breeders face the problem of looking for a dam and sire whose cross will result in a foal of superior body type and characteristic color.

For many years, we tried to raise a grulla foal from our grulla mare—this is the grey dun color, a buckskin derivative. To get the desired conformation we couldn't put her to a Quarter horse stud, the only breed carrying this color gene to any extent.

My Appy breeder friend, Kaz Lewandowski of Rockwood has a gorgeous blue roan stud with typical blanket. Kaz was careful to explain that many Appys are blue roan without carrying this greying gene.

Breeders were also warned against breeding to Palomino or Dun horses—the color is too light for proper Appaloosa definition or breeding to Paint horses—the large splashy spots of the Paint always dominate and mess up the Appy markings.

Apparently the greying gene can be detected in a horse by the presence of white circle of hairs around his eye.
