

# Van's welders win two straight, keep league title for another year

Van's Welding won the Acton Industrial Hockey League championship in convincing style by eliminating Ken's two straight in the best of three games final series.

Van's took the second game Sunday 8-5. The previous week Van's won the first game of the finals by an 11-5 margin over Kemsens.

For Van's it was the second straight year they have grasped the league's top honors. They also finished in first place in the regular season.

Although Ken's never held lead in the game they tied Van's four times Sunday in the arena and looked as if they'd force a third and deciding game next week.

90 fans, Approximately 90 fans, the largest crowd of the season, witnessed the end of the year.

First Ken's tied the game 2-2 on Morrison's second goal of the game, again from Ingles. Cyril Rees who led Van's marksmen with a hat trick got two of his goals in the second period. On the first Floy Hillier picked up an assist and on the second Cooksley and team captain Ed Hillier helped out.

Separating Rees' pair of markers was Ingles' goal for Ken's at the 15:15 mark from Gudgeon.

Cooksley fired his second marker of the evening game from the team captain's brother Floy. Rees un-

leashed his final goal of the long campaign from Bill Lee and again Floy Hillier. Ed Hillier rounded out the team's three goal burst with an unassisted effort at the 15:24 mark.

Ken's Gudgeon narrowed the margin with a single goal from Ingles and Sid Barena. Van's also led in the penalty department with 30 minutes, including a misconduct against Fred (Basher) Buchanan while Ken's settled for 16 penalty minutes.

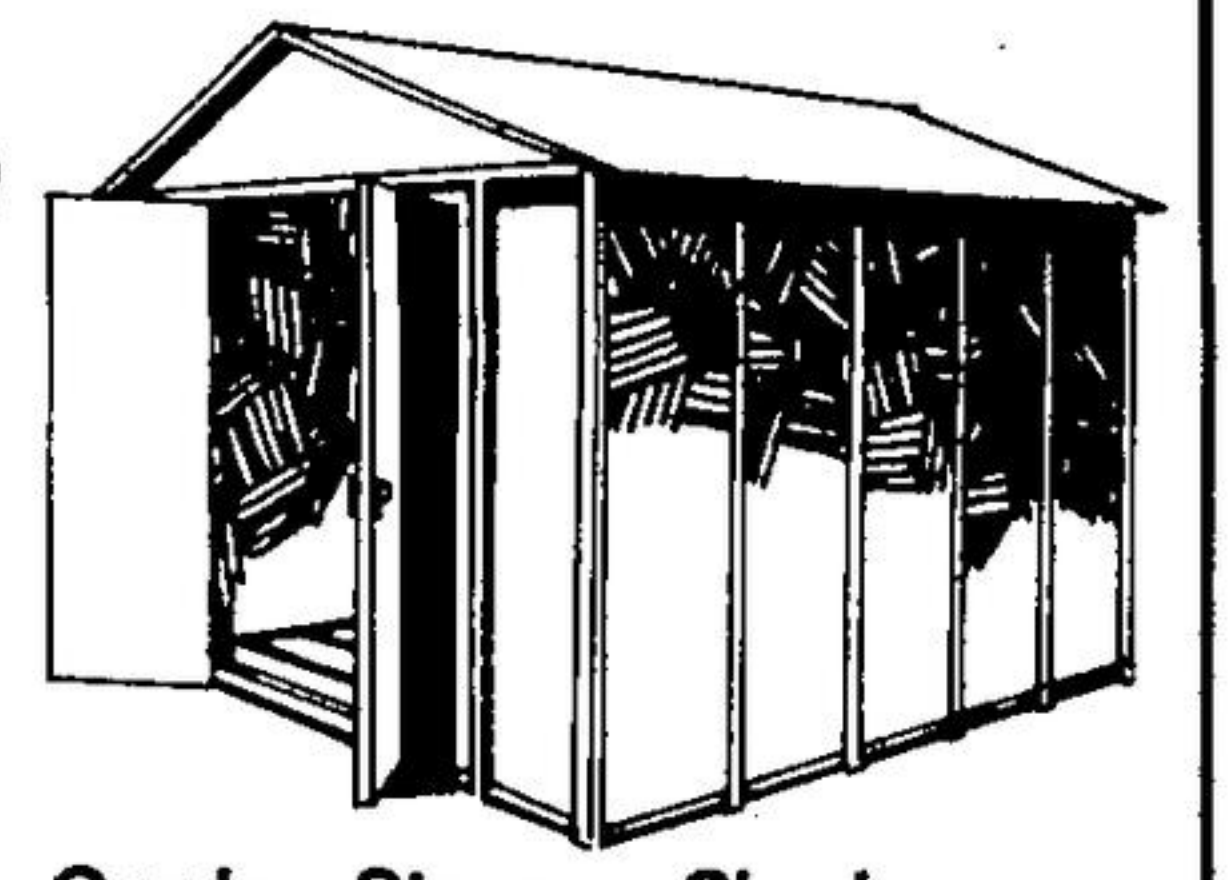
