


1,000 words

BLACKSMITH'S SHOP at Black Creek Pioneer Village caught the eye of Brian Yeoman. He recorded this image with his Pentax.




A picture's worth

A picture, they say, is worth 1,000 words. Most avid photographers believe that old adage, yet all speak a different language when it comes to portraying a subject on film.




