Proposes downtown mall

New books

The old hymnaries introduced into the United church here in 1930 were retired Sunday morning and replaced by over 300 bright red volumes of the new hymn book. The new volume contains many changes.

As a fitting way to dedicate the books, the service was divided into two parts and was mainly composed of congregational singing of hymns. The first section included the old hymns from the old book, dating back to the earliest days of Christianity. These included Holy, Holy, Holy, Welcome Happy Morning, A Safe Stronghold our God is Still, Praise Ye the Lord, When I Survey, Stand Up Stand Up for Jesus, All the Way my Saviour Leads Me and What A Friend We Have in Jesus.

The second part included hymns from the new book such as Joyful Joyful We Adore Thee, Thank You Lord for the Time that is Now, Lord of the Dance, For the Beauty of the Prairies, and Thine is the Glory.

Each hymn was introduced by either the Rev. Chuck Beaton or Mrs. Ethel Denny, chairperson of the worship committee which arranged the purchase of the new books.

The choir also sang and the final hymn was a rousing one, Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory.

Organist George Elliott explained the church could sing three hymns on Sunday out of the new books and still sing nothing new. There were 691 tunes in the old book, 501 in the new. Of these 155 have old tunes.

Ian McGugan had presented Dr. Elliott with a special organist's version.
