day, June 5. The 50th anniversary of the first Leslie reunion was held at "Heralds", the beautiful farm home of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Dolson, Lot 3, Concession 6 West, Chinguacousy, one of the farms which was obtained from the Crown by the pioneer Leslies.

From the beginning "John Leslie and Letty Ann Boke were born and married in the County of Tyrone in Ireland. They came to New York in 1817 and stayed there for two years where they received an order from the British Consul to get land in Canada. Letty Ann and one daughter died in Montreal en-




