At Dundas

Rams try to restart win ways tonight

Rams journey to Dundas for tonight's OLA game which they hope will cut their losing streak at two.

Rams failed to increase their point standings in the Central Division from their last two games against Orangeville Stingers and Owen Sound Satellites.

The two losses leave Rams tied with Rexdale, as of June 8, with six points. They are four up on last place Orillia and four behind four clubs tied at second spot. Windsor leads the eight team division with 15 points.

Stingers clipped Rams 14-10 last Thursday and Satellites took their match 22-16.

Win

In previous encounters with Dundas Bengals, Acton won

at home 14-9, but lost the season opener on the road 14-8.

Rams signed two new players—Wade "Ziggy" Knight and John Van Oort following Monday's practice.

Ram coach Doug Cressman and assistant-coach Mike Marcoux combined to put the team through extensive workouts to seal up the defence.

Against Orangeville the team, in Mr. Cressman's words "Just came up flat". He noted that several Acton shots were right on the net.

Defensively, though, Orangeville players hooked in behind Rams' box formation.

Assistant-coach Marcoux who directed the team against Owen Sound said that the players are talented and

work physically at their posts, but added that they are giving up.

Rams led Owen Sound 6-3 after the first 20-minutes of play. The Satellites however, scored eight in the second and 11 in the third periods while Acton managed only five goals in each frame.

The Owen Sound game was a makeup one following the postponement of the regularly scheduled match of May 17 when the deck in the community centre was too wet to play on safely.

George Artem got four of his seven goals against the Satellites. His output gives him 24 for the season. He is the only Ram to reach the 20 goal mark this year.

One oddity about the Owen Sound game, Ram goalie Doug Taylor got credit for a goal in the first period.

Orangeville burst for five straight goals in the third period which was good enough to put some distance between them and the pesky Rams which had, until then, kept within striking range.

Rams led Stingers for two minutes and twenty-nine seconds in the first period, but trailed the visitors for the rest of the game.

In the penalty department, Acton collected 44 minutes against Owen Sound and 18 on Orangeville, Satellites got 32 minutes.

In the two games, Ron Turkosz got four goals and three assists to raise his season point total to 26. Wayne Young also got four and three while Kevin Marcoux fired in four and helped on four others. Marcoux has 17 season points.

Bill Mathieson registered a pair of goals and picked up an

assist, while Ian Campbell unleashed two goals.

Steve Wilson, of Milton, is dropping his pace, but managed one goal and five points to lead the team with 38 points.

Midget player Bruce McPhail scored a goal against Orangeville and got an assist on Owen Sound.

The other Ram goalie, John DeCoursey, added two assists to bring this season's total to six.

Gary DeLong and Ian McCausland each picked up a single assist.

Shane Sanderson, of Orangeville, added to his total points as the Central Division's scoring leader with two goals and four assists against Acton. Rob Stewart, Roy Bryan, Danny Dinlick and Mike Robinson each got a pair.

Owen Sound marksmen were Mark Kazarian with four goals and Brill Cruickshank and Brian Maher who each got three markers.
