The Ontario Lacrosse Association (OLA) penalized three Ram players with one game suspensions because of incidents during last Wednesday's game at Dundas. Steve Wilson and George Artem lost their choice of paying a \$25 fine because of an incident at the penalty box after the two players had

been tossed out of the game, said Ram manager Dave McMillan. Mr. McMillan went to OLA executive director Jack Christie last Friday to get the official word. Douze Artem doused a penalized Dundas Bengal player with soft drink after the Bengal

(unidentified) took a swing at Artem, says the Ram. "After the ref told us (Artem and Wilson) to leave (the penalty box area), I was walking away with Steve and an arena staff member. I said, 'Here, cool off' and threw some Coke on him. That's when the ref saw me," says Wilson. Wilson said following the incident: "I didn't realize we were to stay in the dressing room, out of the game." He added: "Even after the penalty box incident, the ref said to the arena manager, to take us to the dressing room or to the team box."

Rams collected 103 penalty minutes to Dundas' 31. Rexdale totalled 37 minutes in the sin bin to Acton's 27. Rams got 28 minutes while Orangeville took 22.

## Sabres wait on OHA name new manager

The president of the Ontario Hockey Association's OHA Acton Sabres, which may go Junior "B" from "C" next season, confirmed Tuesday that Fred Buchanan was the unanimous choice as team manager at an executive meeting last week. "It is true, Fred was named manager," Mill Ball said. The club president also confirmed that Mr. Buchanan was the only applicant for the position. When asked why the decision was made at this time, Mr. Ball said: "We felt Fred is the right man. He has several contacts and he is knowledgeable in hockey and of the town."

his association with minor and intermediate hockey, Mr. Ball said: "When you accept the position with a 'B' team, I don't see how it's possible to do the (OHA Intermediate "C") Swords and manage minor hockey." "I'm shocked," Mr. Buchanan said concerning his new position. "It's going to mean a lot of work." But he's still very interested in coaching hockey, especially the younger levels, he said. "You can always juggle the schedule," he said referring to minor hockey. "The Sabres are expecting a decision this week from the OHA concerning the team's application to turn Junior

"B" from "C" next year. The OHA meets tonight, and club president Ball said the application is on the agenda. "We really do have the makings of a fine club," Mr. Buchanan said. He said that he saw no reason why some of the best eight or ten midget players could not make the team such as Jamie Vickery or Bud Buchanan. The new manager also said he hoped players like Kent Kentner, Billy McGilloway and Paul Monahan would return to town. Mr. Buchanan, 39, formerly played intermediate hockey in Acton, Erin, and Cheltenham. He also played for the Georgetown Raiders, and prior to then with the Senior "B" Brampton Consumer's Gas team and other teams.

A comic medical skit designed to entertain spectators during a high school baseball game foreshadowed a not so lighthearted collision between two student players which sent one briefly to hospital. Colin McGillivary, 17, was playing second base Friday afternoon when he and another player ran into each other. Colin pulled ligaments in his right leg. He later said that he'd had some trouble with his right knee before the game.

Teachers Doc Tamblin and Wally Rowley treated Colin on the field. Some students also helped place Colin in Ed Ensing's van which took him to the new medical centre. Colin was later transferred to St. Joseph's Hospital at Guelph where he was given x-rays and treated. Monday Colin made an announcement over the school's PA system to the effect that, had it not been for the efforts of the two teachers who attended to him on the field, that the injury may have been worse.

"Injured" Prior to the second base collision, students Lene Larsen, Helen Robertson—dressed as medical attendants—Shirley Moore and Susan Ancker rushed out onto the field to treat "injured" fielder Chris Mallett. Chris was bandaged and carried on a stretcher from the field by the four bearers. The game continued after both incidents and the teachers won 17-3.
