

OHA gives Sabres "B" status

Acton Sabres are the first Ontario Hockey Association OHA Junior "B" team in the town's 102 year history, but the team officials don't know yet which league will play. "Yes, we're Junior "B" Mill Ball, Sabre president said Tuesday. But he went on to say: "We don't know where we're playing."

The team expects to learn if it is playing in either the Central Division or the Wellington-Waterloo group soon. The team's choice of a coach is also dependent on where its games will be this season. One candidate has already been interviewed, but he is willing only to coach if the Sabres play in the Central Division.

Sabre officials have approached at least two other possible coaches, but no interviews have been held. Last week Fred Buchanan was announced as the team's new manager replacing Bill Campbell. Mr. Campbell is this season's secretary.

Team officials favor the Central Division because of the short distance between towns like Milton and Georgetown from Acton and also because of the rivalry which competition between the towns would generate. One of the reasons the Junior Sabres wished to switch from category "C" to "B" is that the distances to travel in the latter group would cut Sabre bus costs which were nearly \$2,000 last season. Even in the WW group, which includes Guelph, Kitchener, Elmira, Preston, Hespeler and Stratford, the

farthest distance to travel, 62 miles to Stratford, would be 88 miles shorter than last season's trips to Bracebridge. News of the Sabres, advanced up the OHA's alphabet reached Mr. Ball Friday, and ended months of negotiations between the team and the OHA. Those talks peaked

during the OHA's annual meeting at Toronto last April. The switch to "B" from "C" means that home fans will see more of the Sabres this season. Sabres will play 21 home games this season, five more than last year. At the end of last season Sabres tied for last place with

Meaford in the Central Division. In 1975, Sabres finished in fourth spot.

Acton has had one previous "B" hockey team, its first OHA squad which won the group honors in the Intermediate class during the 1929-30 series.

Rams split a pair win fourth of season

Snap Last Thursday the Rams snapped a six game losing streak with a 16-12 win over second place Dundas Bengals at the community centre.

The victory boosts Rams win total to four with nearly three-quarters of the 20 game season over. Rams next game is at Rexdale Friday.

George Artem collected eight assists on goals by teammates at Windsor. He also tallied a trio of markers here against Bengals.

The blond triggerman from Milton, Steve Wilson, registered three hits at Windsor plus two against Dundas. He also helped out on four other goals.

Number 16 for Rams, Fred Allen, put away three goals in the two games last week.

Ron Turkosz, who sat out the Dundas game because of a suspension, fired two goals into Windsor's net.

Newcomer Wade Knight assisted on a pair of goals, while goal tenders Doug Taylor and John DeCoursey got single assists. Ian Campbell and John Van Oort also got single assists.

Top marksmen for Dundas

were Geoff Burns, Jerry Mueller and Charlie Thompson with two goals each. Chris Jacques led the WAA with four goals.
