Halton Hills pays \$10,000
Halton Hills taxpayers will pay \$10,000 more in school taxes this year because that part of the town of Milton, formerly the township of Nassagaweya, has its taxes reduced by \$78,800.
An arbitrator's report handed down after an appeal by the town of Milton decided the 1976 school taxes placed an undue burden on ratepayers of the municipality. A compromise was reached halfway between the amount demanded and the amount a revised equalization factor suggested.
"It means," Halton Hills treasurer Ray King told the finance committee of Halton Hills council "that ratepayers in Nassagaweya will pay the same for education as ratepayers here."
King said the whole equalization factor business, a complicated system for figuring school taxes, would be eliminated when the Province completes the job of market assessment, now expected to be 1978. Comparisons now show that part of Halton (Nassagaweya) was paying more for education than the remainder of the region.
"I think it is fair," he told the committee. "Our levy will be adjusted in next year's education level," taxpayers here won't pay the extra \$10,000 until '77 and taking the entire education budget into account it is a minimal amount, King suggested.
Halton municipal treasurers served as arbitrators in the case similar to ones received from Nassagaweya in 1972 and 1973 and from Milton in 1974 and 1975. The same formula for apportioning school costs was adopted as in those years.
Specifically, the report said, in 1968 the county assessor had calculated an equalization factor of 27.706696 per cent in Nassagaweya, compared with an average of 31.74668757 per cent in the region as a whole or 87.274 per cent of the average within the county.
The factor used in Nassagaweya is 18.4 compared with an average of 26.92 in the region as a whole or 68.346 per cent of the average in the region at the elementary school level is 26.89, resulting in different figures but the arbitrators recommended the revised factor be the same at both levels.
They recommended the factor should be moved up halfway between 68.346 per cent and 87.274 per cent. Taking the average in the region to be 26.92, Nassagaweya is to be 77.810 per cent of this or 20.95.
The recommendation means a reduction of approximately eight mills for former Nassagaweya residents and an increase of approximately one-eighth of a mill for all other ratepayers in the region... or \$10,000 for Halton Hills taxpayers.

Will study expansion
Halton Regional Council approved plans to study the potential for servicing limited residential development in hamlets and villages around the region during its meeting Wednesday.
In doing so, the council reversed a decision it made just a few weeks ago. At that time the region's planning committee had rejected such a study on the grounds that people now living in those areas might rather have them remain small quiet hamlets, as they are now.
Needless expense
Planning Committee Chairman Mary Munro argued that the region could be spending money needlessly if they went ahead with the study.
The land use for the areas should be planned first.

"Then if it meets the criteria we should check to see if services could be provided," she said.
She suggested any rural development plan might be scuppered for social or cost reasons and in that case, the servicing wouldn't matter anyway.
No sense
Works committee member Gordon Brown said there was no sense in planning the area and finding it is right for development, if it cannot be serviced. As far as the contention that the hamlets may be happy to remain small, Councillor Brown suggested no one should be denied the right to live where they wanted.
The firm of Underwood and McLellan and Associates will handle the study. The task will be to investigate the potential water supply, and sewage disposal systems in the rural settlement areas including Kibridge, Lowellville, Campbellville, Brookville, Moffat, Stewarttown, Limehouse, Glen Williams, and Norval, and to determine the potential for growth in the defined areas.

Pledge support
Support for Canadian air traffic controllers and airline pilots, who have walked off their jobs in protest of the federal government's announced intention to permit bilingual communication between aircraft and control towers at Montreal's two major airports, has been pledged by a group of about 100 Georgetown and area residents. The group met at Cedarvale last Wednesday night.
The meeting resolved to indicate its support of the pilots' and air traffic controllers' stand by turning on headlights in any motor vehicles they are driving, until the issue is resolved. The group also decided to send a telegram outlining the recommended action to all members of parliament. A total of \$85 was collected by passing the hat and the money is to be used in an effort to encourage other concerned Canadians to take similar action.
Provincial Transportation Minister Jim Snow, who left the annual giant barbecue at his Hornby farm to attend the meeting, announced he has already informed Federal Transport Minister Otto Lang of his support for the pilots and air traffic controllers. Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed also said he stands with the pilots and controllers, as did provincial candidates Bill Johnson of the NDP and George Gray of Progressive Conservatives.
Georgetown caterer Dave Kentner, who along with building contractor Jim Bowles, organized the meeting, explained that Halton MP Dr. Frank Philbrook had told him in a telephone conversation that he would like to be at the meeting, but that he was unable to get back to his riding because of the walkout. "I do not fault Dr. Philbrook for not being here," he said. Philbrook did send a representative, Steve Ormsby of Acton, recently elected to the Halton Liberal Association. Ormsby said he was sent as an observer and did not speak.
Air Canada pilot Sam Gilmore, a Georgetown resident and Paul Aicken of Water-down, secretary-treasurer of the Toronto division of air traffic controllers were also asked to speak at the meeting, which was chaired by Doug Fishburn.
