

Commercial Shearing Open House

Open House was held last Friday at the newly-enlarged Commercial Shearing plant, 6 Commerce Court.

Company officials from the head office at Youngstown, Ohio; customers, friends and families of employees all gathered at the roomy plant to see through it and enjoy refreshments.

Commercial Shearing expanded its Acton plant in the fall of 1975. The \$120,000 steel addition doubled the space in the building, providing 13,800 square feet for valve and pump assembly.

The company here builds hydraulic pumps, motors and valves needed for backhoes, fork lifts, loaders, dump trucks, garbage packers, cherry pickers, paving and mining equipment, for instance.

Components are shipped to the plant from the U. S. and other parts of Canada.

Managing director Charles Cushman, sales manager Paul Fergus and plant supervisor William Lathrop came up from Ohio to the Acton plant. Others in the office are accountant Ron Parsons,

production manager William Kozak, assistant to the sales manager Tammy Pinsonneault, receptionist Kay Covell and inventory clerk Carole Goy.

In the plant are shop foreman Bruce Hayward; Bill Dumarch, who is sub-assembler and drill press operator; Alex Gray a pump assembler and tester, Robert Johanson, valve assembler and tester, Sheldon Barker valve assembler and tester, Wes Palmer valve assembler and tester, Colin Ash hone operator and valve assembler, Steve Tilley provider and shipper's helper, Maureen Gerth shipping clerk, Garry Foster maintenance and drill press operator, Flora Barber valve assembler and drill press operator and Irene Hooper, also a valve assembler and drill press operator.

Plant manager Charles Cushman III is also secretary of the board of directors of the large company. His father Charles Cushman Jr. was president of the company from 1951 to 1975 and chairman of the board from 1961 to 1975; he died in 1975. His widow was here for the Open House.

Other special guests who

came from Youngstown: chairman of the board Thomas Travers with Mrs. Travers and young Robert; P. Przelomski who is in charge of security with Mrs. Przelomski who incidentally is city editor of the Youngstown daily newspaper; vice-president of the company B. Hodgson and Mrs. Hodgson; lawyer Giv Manchester and Mrs. Manchester, as well as Sheldon Sherman from the New Jersey office.

Louis Charlebois, president of the Acton Chamber of Commerce, and other Acton businessmen attended and enjoyed lunch with the large group.

With head office in Youngstown, Commercial Shearing has 11 district sales offices in the States, and main offices at Acton, Bedford, England, Diekirch, Luxembourg; Lucern, Switzerland; Sao Paulo, Brazil; South Melbourne, Australia, and Tokyo, Japan.

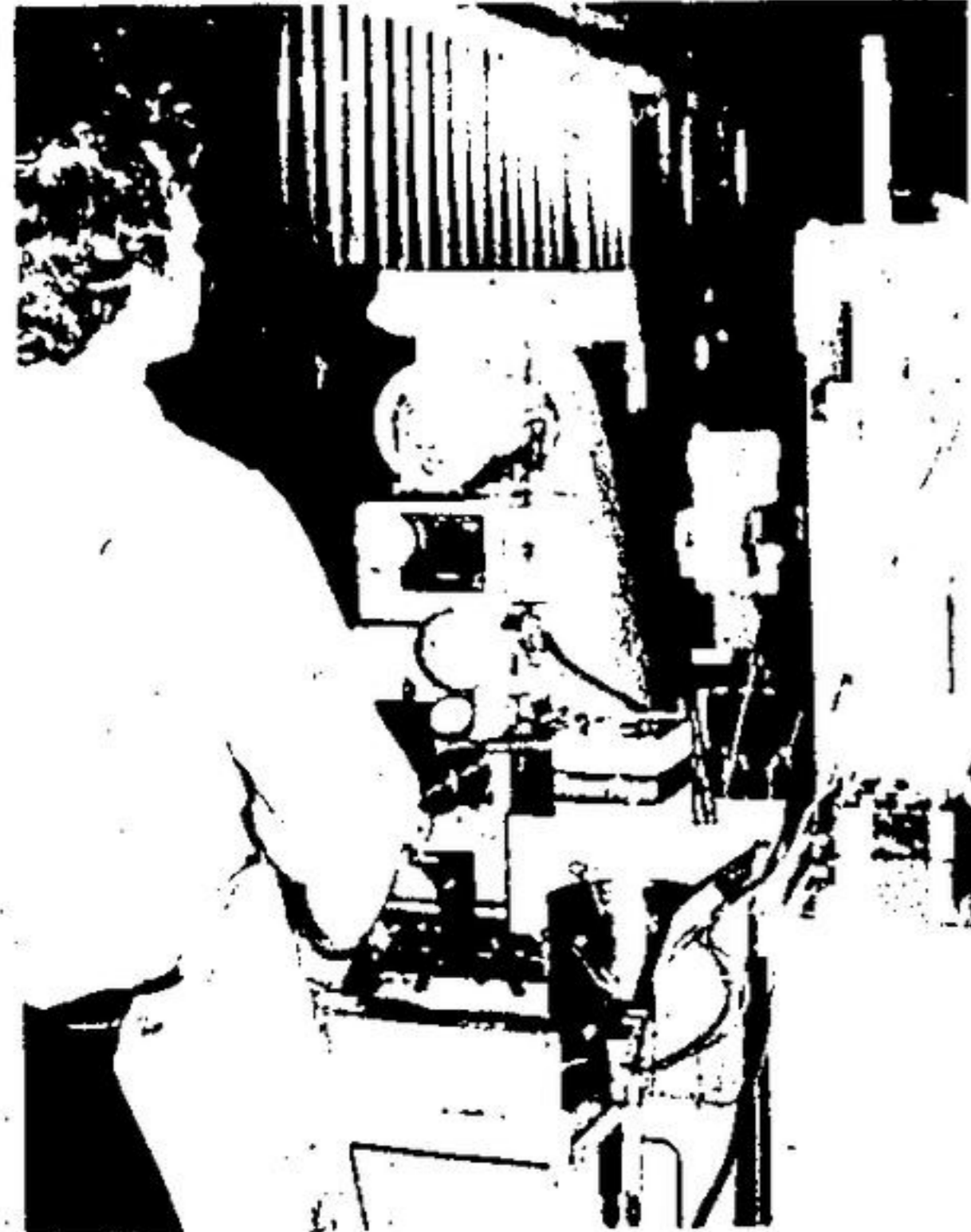

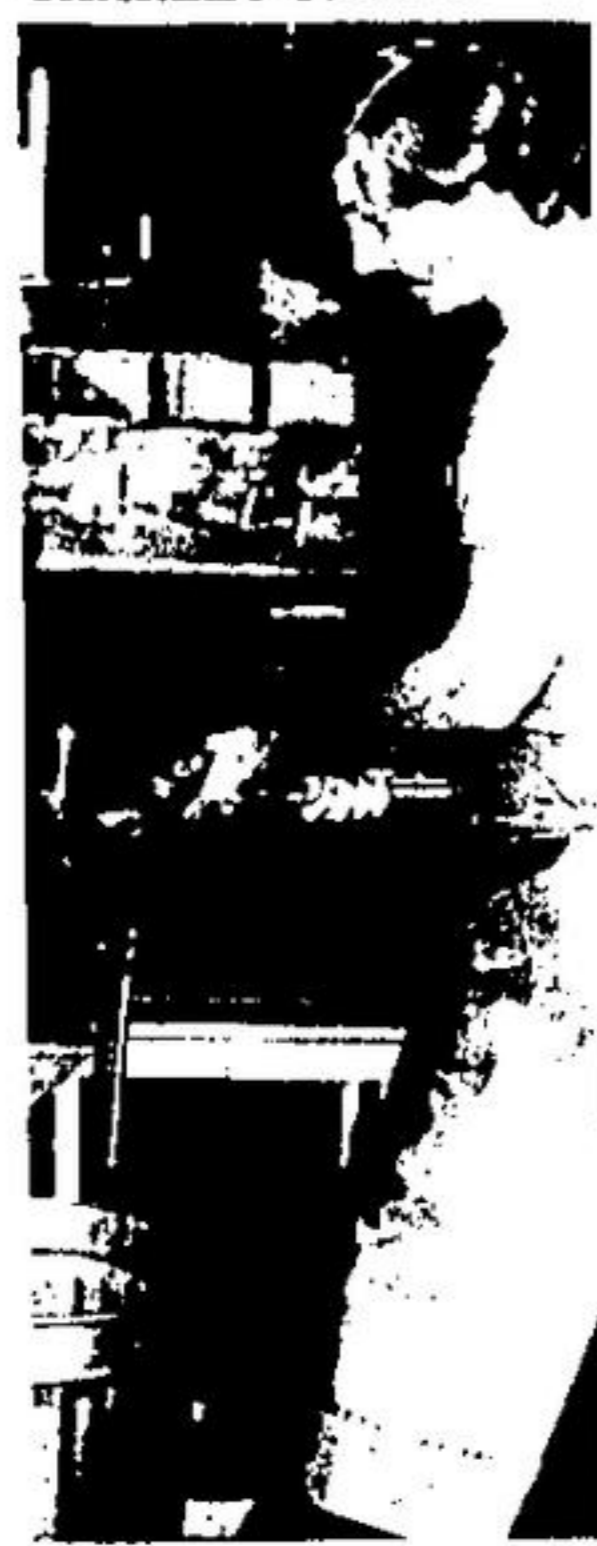
