Owen Sound eyes title Monarchs trail by one

Owen Sound's midget lacrosse team moved to within one win of the Ontario Minor Lacrosse Association "C" division title by doubling the score over Wednesday.

The Carr's Delux Coach midgets, at Owen Sound, took the two games to one lead in the best of five series by ebbing a lead they first performed in the second game of the playoffs. They fired a half-dozen goals in the last period while keeping Monarchs off the score sheet.

The Carrs returned north by bus, with a 10-5 victory. Monarchs first fell victim to the Sound's six goal burst, up north, on the unluckiest day of any month—Friday the 13th. The score then was 14-6 for Owen Sound.

Acton's Monarchs won the first game of the title deciding series with a healthy 13-8 tally here on August 9.

In the third game, before 37 spectators, the Acton team seemed to have the better of the visitors at the end of 40 minutes of play. Monarchs led 5-4. However, the ten Acton players slowed down in the next round, the 17 Owen Sound players were still fresh.

Gary Williams and Pete Hurdle missed the game because of suspensions. Williams is slated to return for the next match. Hurdle will only be allowed to return if the series goes the distance.

In addition to missing the where-with-all to score in the third period some Acton players waited for long

passes from their comrades. The Carrs intercepted several of them and immediately headed for Acton's net.

Monarch goalie Peter Turkosz deflected, smothered or caught many Owen Sound shots, especially when they came from directly in front of him. He could not be faulted for the majority of goals against him.

Turkosz' mates, however, failed to clear away many Carr shooters who planted themselves on either side of Monarch's net during the third frame.

The first two-thirds of the contest were very close with the sides exchanging the lead.

Monarchs took a one to zip lead on Shane Withers' first of two goals from Mike Rippon

and team captain Bruce McPhail at the 35 mark of the opener. Owen Sound's Paul Grimoldby netted his first of four goals to tie things up.

Five minutes passed before Carrs next scored, on Jack Watson's only goal. Peter Luty matched up the score for Acton when he picked up a pass in Monarchs' zone and beat two Carrs in a race to Owen Sound's net.

Again Owen Sound edged back into the lead, this time on Bill Madill's first third of a hat trick. Rippon let loose a shot that evened the first period tally at three-apiece. Todd McIntyre and McPhail assisted on the goal.

In the next frame, Acton replied twice after Owen Sound's Grimoldby gave his squad a 4-3 lead.

Withers combined with Rippon for Monarchs' next goal. Withers, however, wrote himself out of any further scoring plays when he was sent out of the game for charging.

With less than two minutes to play in the sandwich period, Larry Kurtz took a pass from Rippon and goalie Turkosz to convert it into Monarch's last goal of the game. It gave Acton a 5-4 lead going into the final 20 minutes.

Owen Sound dominated the scoring of the final frame with Grimoldby and Madill pulling the trigger twice each and singles from Bill Walton and Paul Livingston.

Ricky Gibson, John Toebes and Vaughn Cole also play for Acton's Monarchs.
