**MPP has new list of phones**

A new list of emergency telephone numbers is being issued to riding households this week from Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed's office, after errors were discovered in a list he issued late in July.

Mr. Reed told this newspaper it was "unfortunate" about the errors and he apologizes for any inconvenience the mistakes may have caused anyone in the riding.

But he also pointed out that several of the wrong numbers were given to his staff by people in the offices listed, or from out of date telephone directories.

His "Report from Queen's Park" listed 30 handy local emergency numbers such as police, fire, ambulance, hospital, distress centres and municipal offices. But eight of the 30 numbers were incorrect. Some were only typographical errors, others were out of date numbers and some were completely erroneous.

Most of the errors were in Halton Hills (Acton and Georgetown) lists. The Milton and Burlington numbers appeared to be alright. His office received several complaints about the wrong numbers.

**Police network \$1/2 million**

Halton Regional Police will be buying a new communications system for more than half a million dollars.

At a recent meeting of Halton Police Commission members met behind closed doors and after consultation with officials from the Ontario Police Commission decided to award the contract for the new communications system to Canadian General Electric.

General Electric won the contract with a bid of \$696,064.84. The commission also recommended Halton Region pick up 25 per cent of the tab and Queen's Park 75 per cent.
