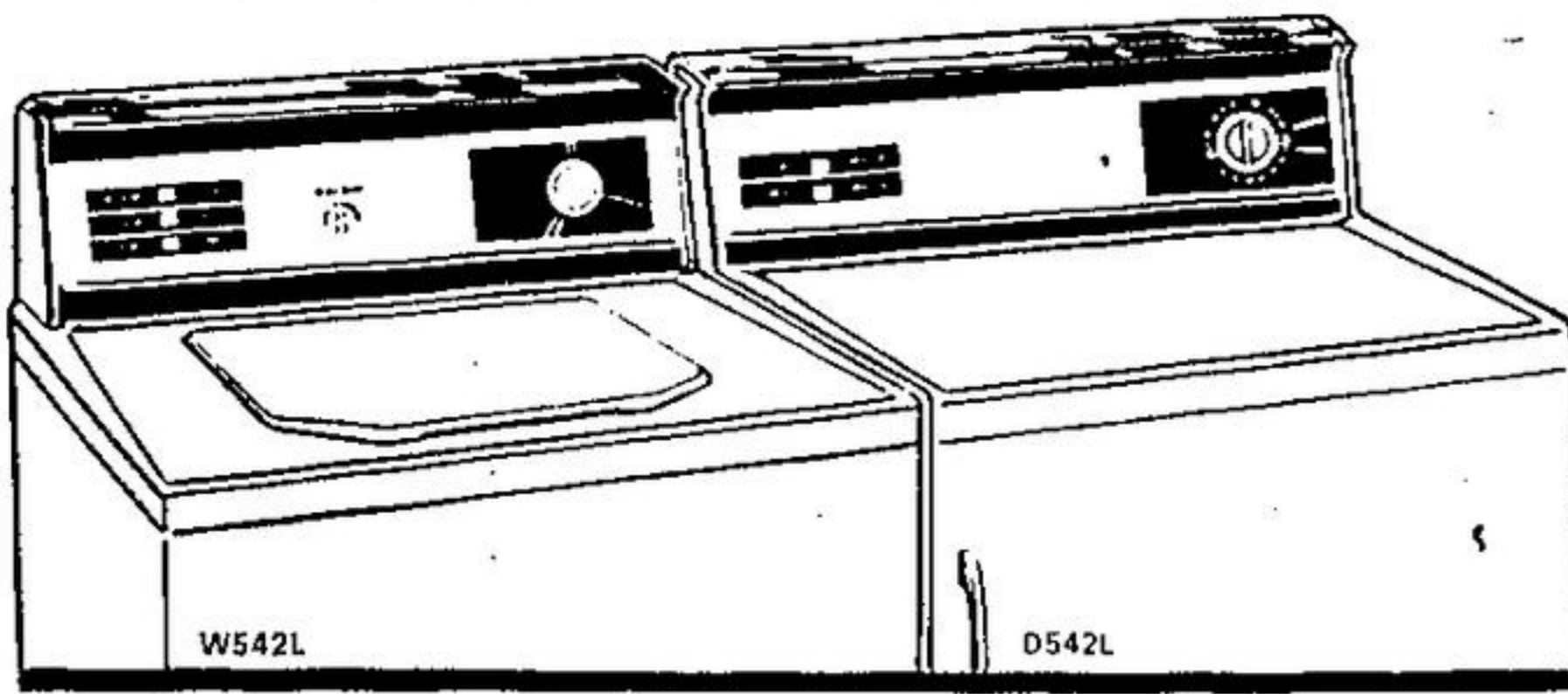
DANIEL CONIGLIO, held by mother Anna, is top baby in the category for boys up to six months. The Coniglios live at 32 Mill E.
