

Restored Hortop Mill dedicated on Sunday

Harry Hortop left his home on an Everton hill Sunday to join about 200 people gathered for the dedication of the restored Hortop Mill. After all the official ceremonies, Mr. Hortop returned home to celebrate his 71st birthday.

Eramosa Township Reeve Bill Adsett and councillor John Hewitt, who chaired the restoration committee, coordinated the opening ceremonies.

Costumes Several of the crowd seated on benches in front of the red colored building wore 19th-century costumes for the

opening. Mrs. Vera Blythe, past-president of the Wellington County Historical Research Society, Warden Trask and former MPP John Root addressed the gathering on the significance of the restoration to Everton and the area.

Several representatives from the Grand River Conservation Authority, Eramosa councillors plus the Rockwood and Eden Mills trustees were recognized.

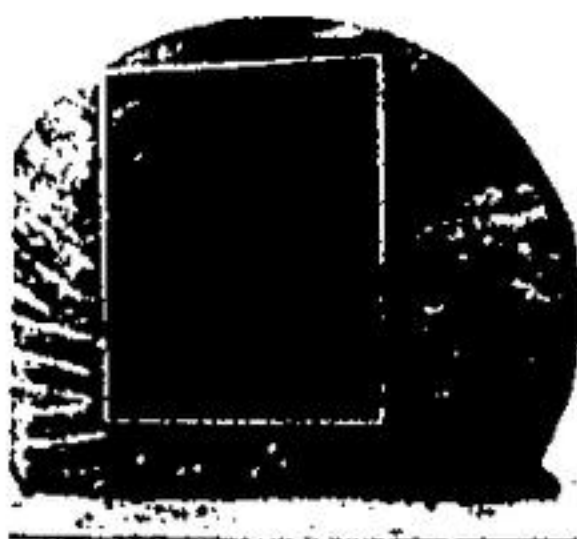
Everton Mr. Hortop and his wife were introduced as were the eldest and youngest residents of Everton. T. D. McCutcheon, who was 88 years and

three months old Sunday sat in the front row with two-month old Cheryl Zions in his arms through the dedication.

After the speech making Mr. Hortop, Mr. Root and Joe Benham, who supervised the restoration, unveiled a plaque set in a mill stone in front of the hill. Eramosa councillor Betty Lou Clark assisted in the unveiling.

A short parade with the Fergus Pipe Band brought dignitaries from a nearby church to the mill.

Hortop Mill restoration was sponsored by the Wellington County Historical Society and the Township of Eramosa.

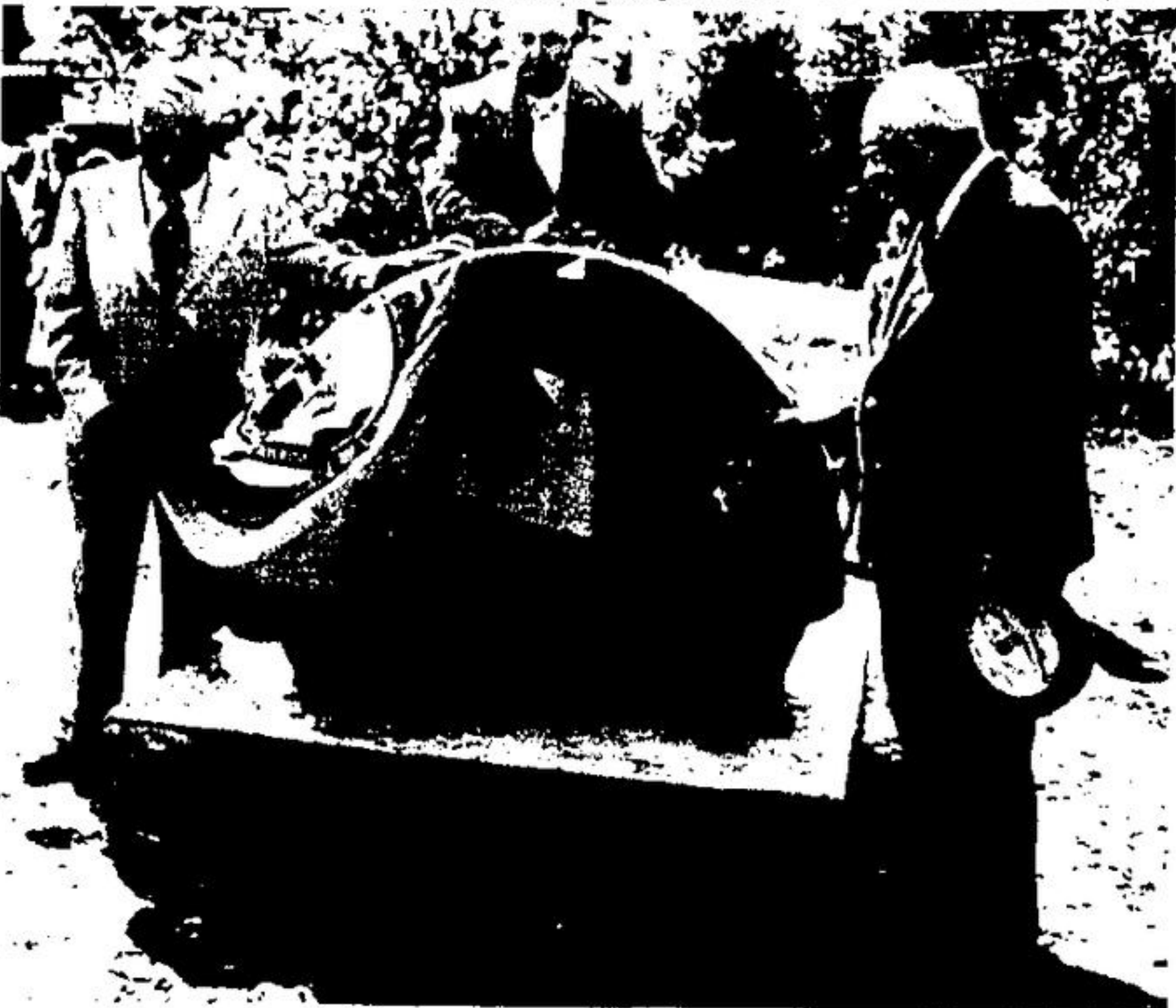
