Along with 300 other Cancer Society volunteers, Marion Patterson attended workshops conducted by professional health consultants and teachers. The delegates learned about the cancer education materials available to people in the community and about the most effective way to use these materials to educate the

'The Canadian Cancer Society has an important message to tell," said Marion Patterson. "But in this age of mass information it is at times difficult to be heard. Our message is quite simple, all we're asking is that people practise the Seven Steps to

The Canadian Cancer Society's Seven Steps to Health are: Have a medical and dental check-up; watch for any change in your normal state of health; find out about any lump or sore that does not heal; protect your-

self against too much sunlight; do not smoke; have a Pap test; and do a monthly breast self-examination,

Marion Patterson said, 'The canadian Cancer Society has a wide variety of learning materials available free of charge for schools, clubs and any other interested organizations. We have films for youth, adults, men and women's groups and pamphlets in language," she said, "as well as school kits, mall and fair displays and a roster of public speakers."
