
We used the same batch of charcoal all day in these ovens, which reach quite a high temperature and decided that they are a truly economical way of cooking at

Crush clear crystal candies with a hammer and put small amounts of each color into the spaces between the pastry window frames. Bake about 15 minutes in a medium hot oven. The candy melts between the pastry and when held up to the light these cookies really look like stained glass windows and seem too good to eat, but are delicious.
