

No Acton rep on Memorial Arena committee

The committee raising funds to pay for the repairs to Georgetown Memorial Arena lacked a representative from

Acton, when last Wednesday night's meeting closed. Councillor Ernie Sykes, chairman of the committee, asked for a representative from Acton, but failed to get a positive response. Art Gordon, past president of the Acton Lions Club, Don Murdy, the club's current president, and Acton Rotary Club president Don McDonald attended. McDonald had to leave early because of a previous commitment. Gordon, who emphasized he was speaking as an individual not as a Lions Club member, said he wanted to know the reason why \$50,000 was so hard to raise among Acton, Esquesing and Georgetown. Councillor Sykes said he was pleased the committee

had been able to raise \$33,000 in three weeks. "Even the Lions Club in their efforts can't raise that," he suggested. Gordon then claimed that the Acton Lions Club had offered \$50,000 cash to put in a new arena and had been laughed at. Sykes conceded that perhaps he, as chairman, had not set his sights high enough. "We've all got to do it," he said. "If I haven't set my sights high enough, let me know." Councillor Pat McKenzie, who was at the meeting as an observer, asked about the possibility of a door-to-door canvass. He reminded the committee the Acton Lions Club had taken that route in the drive for their indoor swimming pool. "The impression I got from the clubs the last time was that they'd like to raise the money in their own way," Sykes said. Gordon insisted he'd like to know what the score is. "Over

the whole deal I think Acton's the only place that's carried its load," he said. When Sykes said he was not prepared to comment on the statement, Gordon clarified his statement. "What I meant to say," he added, "was that Acton has carried the full load of what it got from Halton Hills, not that Acton is carrying Esquesing and Georgetown." Ross Irwin of the Georgetown Lions Club then suggested that a committee should be formed to go and ask Acton how much they want to pledge. "I'm sure Acton will carry their load," said Gordon. "If it comes to the point where Acton, Esquesing and Georgetown will be one body, let's work together. It's all we need to make the whole thing work. Next year, we may be back, asking for something for our end."

Pointing out that it has been council's objective to make The meeting ended with no Acton representation on the committee. "If this was done by direct taxation," said Sykes, "it would affect the taxes in the whole town. There's no reason why Acton should feel they're doing anything else but saving money for themselves. This is a Halton Hills arena with equal opportunity for people of the whole town, not just Georgetown." Gordon suggested it was Sykes' responsibility to select people willing to serve on a committee. Several representatives of Georgetown service clubs volunteered, but when Gordon was asked he first suggested Don McDonald to represent Acton. McDonald had left by that time so was not able to answer. Gordon then nominated Murdy, who declined.

- (2) No nomination is valid unless there is filed with the nomination paper a consent in writing to the nomination and a declaration of qualification in the prescribed form by the person nominated.
- (3) A nomination paper nominating a person for an office the holder of which is required to be elected by public school electors shall be signed by public school electors only. 1974's 20(2).
- (4) A nomination paper nominating a person for an office the holder of which is required to be elected by separate school electors shall be signed by separate school electors only. 1974's 20(3).
- (5) Each candidate for election to an office shall be nominated by a separate nomination paper, but an elector may sign the nomination papers of different candidates.
- (6) After a nomination paper is filed with the clerk it shall remain in the possession of the clerk.
- (7) The onus is on the person nominated for election to an office to file a bona fide nomination paper.

If a greater number of candidates than required to fill the said offices are nominated and make the required declarations, notice of the time for the holding of the poll, including the advance poll and notice of the last day for making applications for a certificate to vote by proxy will be given forthwith.

SCHEDULE C

DEFINITION OF ESTATE, RIGHT OR INTEREST REQUIRED

A limited estate, right or interest is required in the land (herein called "the strip") as set forth in the description hereunto attached as Schedule and made part hereof, namely, the right, privilege and easement in perpetuity.

1. To construct, repair, rebuild, replace, maintain and operate an electrical transmission line (herein called "the line") including towers, poles, and all necessary or convenient guys, anchors, wires, cross-arms, apparatus, accessories and appurtenances belonging thereto, in, over, along and upon the strip.
2. To cut and prune selectively trees and shrubs on the strip and to keep all trees and shrubs on or under the strip or any portion thereof, provided that the operation and maintenance of the line is not endangered or interfered with.
3. To clear the strip and keep it clear of all buildings, structures or other obstructions of any nature whatever. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in all cases where in the sole discretion of Ontario Hydro the safe operation and maintenance of the line is not endangered or interfered with the landowner from time to time or the person or persons entitled thereto may with prior written approval of Ontario Hydro at his or their own expense construct and maintain roads, lanes, walks, drains, sewers, water pipes, oil and gas pipelines, fences on or under the strip or any portion thereof, provided that prior to commencing any such installation the landowner shall give to Ontario Hydro 30-days' notice in writing so as to enable Ontario Hydro to have a representative inspect the site and be present during the performance of the work and that the landowner complies with any instructions that may be given by any such representative in order that such work may be carried out in such a manner as not to endanger, damage or interfere with the line.
4. To erect, maintain and use bridges and such gates in all fences which are now or may hereafter be on the strip as Ontario Hydro may from time to time consider necessary.
5. To install at a minimum depth of 12 inches below the surface of the land, and maintain, and use an underground conductor or conductors for grounding purposes when and where required within the strip.
6. To enter on and to pass and repass at any and all times in, over, along and upon the strip for the servants, agents, contractors and subcontractors of Ontario Hydro with or without vehicles, supplies, machinery and equipment for all purposes necessary or convenient to the exercise and enjoyment of the right, privilege and easement hereby exprest subject to payment by Ontario Hydro of compensation for any crop or other damage to the person entitled thereto caused by the exercise of this right of entry and passageway.

Halton proceeds with Swine flu vaccination

Halton Regional Health Unit will proceed with the Influenza vaccination program as recommended by the National Advisory Committee on Immunizing Agents, Halton MOH Dr. J. H. Chamberlain announced this week. "Only persons with known hypersensitivity to egg protein should not receive the vaccine. "Bivalent (A/Victoria/74; A/New Jersey/76) will be offered to persons with chronic illnesses by their family physicians. Persons over 65 years of age will be offered the vaccine at Health Unit clinics. "If you have any type of

heart disease, lung disease, such as asthma, chronic bronchitis, emphysema, tuberculosis, diabetes mellitus, or any other chronic disorder, consult your family physician regarding administration of the Bivalent vaccine." Special clinic locations and dates for persons over 65 years of age to receive the Bivalent vaccine will likely be published within the next three weeks. Monovalent vaccine (A New Jersey/76) will be offered to persons 20 years to 65 years of age by the Health Unit at special clinics as soon

as the vaccine is available. This vaccine will not likely arrive for a few weeks. None for children As yet there is not a vaccine recommended for children, but the Ontario Ministry of Health plans to begin negotiations with manufacturers for the development of a vaccine suitable for children, Dr. Chamberlain noted. To receive your injection, watch this paper for clinic times and locations closest to you. The date the Bivalent vaccine will be available from your family physician will also be published and broadcast.

The meeting was sponsored by the Halton-Burlington Provincial Liberal Association. The Liberal party is conducting similar meetings across Ontario to determine the feelings of the people, and their chief concerns. Hill absent Three of the four advertised speakers were present. Halton Hills Mayor Tom Hill was absent, and due to "the situation" in Halton Hills, no elected representative could be found to fill in for him, explained chairman Grant Caseley, president of the sponsoring group.

Emergency fund could be set up

A "Replacement of Works Equipment Fund" could be set up in the future for Halton Hills. Town Treasurer Ray King made up a report on such a fund and presented it to Halton Hills Finance and Personnel committee Monday evening. He explained that the fund would be used for emergencies not budgeted for, such as a new grader, if the old one gave out unexpectedly. Councillor Harry Levy said he agreed with the fund for the replacement of equipment. He did, however, say if it was not set up for this purpose, there would be no use in having it.
